



Undergraduate Degrees/ Training Programs

- Hospitality Management Degree Completion
 - 41 students/276 SCH in AY19/20
 - Raised \$24,000 scholarship support from the Educational Foundations of the Greater Kansas City Restaurant /Hotel and Lodging Associations
 - Working towards 2+2 program with Johnson County
 Community College
- Exploring degree completion program in production horticulture



Engagement/Extension (Outreach and Service)

 Food Safety Extension – Numerous presentations to community groups; \$874,000 raised in support of local food growers' programs

 K-12 – Virtual Food Science Summer Camp for 100+ middle school students/parents



Undergraduate Degrees/ Training Programs

 HackerU – partner in offering industry recognized certificates in cybersecurity, digital marketing, and other digital skills programs. First cohort in cybersecurity enrolled 27 students, nearly all of whom are expected to move on to the advanced training.
