

Undergraduate application instructions

Application

Complete this application or apply for admission to K-State electronically at www.k-state.edu/admit/apply. Admissions criteria can be reviewed at www.k-state.edu/admissions.

Application fee

Applicants are required to pay a \$30 nonrefundable application fee. Applications are not processed until the application fee is received or credit card payment is verified.

Include applicant's full name on check or money order payable to *Kansas State University*. Checks returned uncollectible by the financial institution are subject to an additional \$30 returned check fee.

Deadline

Applications are accepted up to 15 months before the first class day each semester. If an application file is complete at least seven working days before the first day of classes, an admissions decision will be made before the first day of classes. Otherwise, the decision may be delayed until after the first day of classes, and a \$50 fee will be assessed to the student account for late enrollment.

Readmission (no application fee)

Signature

Name

ACT/SAT scores

All new freshman applicants are expected to provide ACT or SAT scores. The ACT Plus writing test is not required. Request that your scores be sent directly to the Office of Admissions.

Final high school transcript

Have your high school electronically sent (through Docufiled or ConnectEDU transcript services only), mail, or fax an official copy of your final high school transcript showing your high school graduation date.

Transfer credit

All previous academic work, including college courses taken while in high school, must be reported. Official transcripts must be electronically sent (through Docufiled or ConnectEDU transcript services only), mailed, or faxed directly to the Office of Admissions from the registrar's office of each institution you previously attended. Transcripts are also required if you enrolled and

withdrew or received no credit. Your admission record is not complete until all official transcripts are received.

Citizenship Immigration status

Residency

NEW FRESHMAN AND FRESHMAN TRANSFER INFORMATION

All students who graduated from an accredited high school and are 21 years of age or older must submit a final high school transcript or GED and ACT or SAT scores. Students graduating from an accredited high school who will not be 21 years old by the first day of classes are eligible for admission upon achieving any one of the following criteria.

Freshman transfer students who will not have completed 24 college hours after high school graduation must also meet one of the following criteria, in addition to having a cumulative college GPA of 2.0 or higher.

[1] An ACT composite score of 21 or higher or SAT CR+M of 980 or higher.

[3] Complete the Kansas precollege curriculum with a GPA of 2.0 or higher. Out-of-state residents must earn a 2.5 in the precollege curriculum.

[2] Rank in the top one third of your graduating class. Class rank is recorded from your high school transcript. If your high school does not rank students you cannot qualify for admission under this requirement.

If you don't meet any of the first three criteria, you should still apply for admission. K-State has a process for individually reviewing student files.

Precollege curriculum

One unit = 1 year or 2 semesters

Submit your high school transcript at the time of application, including course schedules for current and future semesters. Also submit a final high school transcript to verify high school graduation and completion of required courses.
