

Application procedure

A nonrefundable \$80 application fee must be submitted with your application. Only international money orders or U.S. currency will be accepted. No request for admission will be processed until this fee has been received in the Office of Admissions. Application fees are subject to change without notice.

Please answer all questions. If the question does not apply to you, please answer with N/A (not applicable). Sign the application to certify accuracy and completeness. An incomplete application may delay processing.

You can apply electronically through K-State's homepage: www.ksu.edu/admit. Your application will not be processed until we receive the application fee.

Application deadline

Fall	June 1
Spring	October 1
Summer	March 1

Your application may not be considered if you do not meet these deadlines.

Academic documentation required

We strongly encourage you to submit an academic evaluation report from a credential service. Applications can be processed more quickly when you provide a credential evaluation. The service used must be a member of NACES (National Association of Credential Evaluation Services). A list of current NACES members is available at www.naces.org/members.htm.

If you do not use a credential evaluation service, you must provide translated copies of your *entire* secondary and postsecondary school records from your home country. If you have attended a college or university in the United States, transcripts from these colleges must also be sent *directly* from each registrar's office to the Kansas State University Office of Admissions. All documents submitted become the property of the university and cannot be returned.

Financial documentation required

Kansas State University requires a proper and current affidavit of support from your sponsor stating that he or she will provide \$32,315 for each year of study at Kansas State University and a statement of verification from the sponsor's financial establishment. The form required by Kansas State University for this

purpose is enclosed. You must have the form signed by your sponsor and notarized by a public or government official within one year of your intended enrollment at Kansas State University. **Unfortunately, we do not have financial assistance funds available for undergraduate international students.**

Please note: Students may not sponsor themselves or other students. The financial affidavit must be signed by someone other than the student making application or the student's spouse.

Kansas State University does not accept certificates of balance as a substitute for the signed bank portion of the affidavit.

If your sponsor's bank is unable or unwilling to sign our form, the bank must submit a letter to the Office of Admissions stating its policy.

English language proficiency documentation

You can be admitted without a TOEFL score or proof of English proficiency. However, once you arrive, you will be required to take the English Proficiency Test (EPT). The results of the EPT will determine if you have to study English, either full-time or part-time, or if you are ready to begin full-time university courses. This is to ensure that you have the necessary English skills to be successful in your career at K-State.

You will not have to take the English Proficiency Test (EPT) on arrival if you have:

- A TOEFL score of 550 (score on each part must be 55 or higher) OR
- a TOEFL CBT (computer based) score of 213 (score on each part must be 21 or higher) and a writing score of 5.0 OR
- a TOEFL iBT (internet based) score of 80 (score on each part must be 20 or higher) OR
- an IELTS score of 6.5 overall (score on each part must be 6.0 or higher) OR
- completed Composition I and II with grades of C or higher at an accredited institution in the United States OR
- an English subscore of 23 or higher on the ACT OR
- a verbal score of 530 or higher on the SAT.

Documentation of English proficiency must be submitted to the Admissions Office PRIOR to the first day of the English Proficiency Test at the beginning of the semester. Evidence submitted AFTER that time will not be considered.

Selection criteria

In most cases, international applicants seeking admission to Kansas State University must meet the same academic standards for admission as American students. There are wide variations, however, between educational systems throughout the world that make exact comparisons of educational standards difficult. You will be admitted on the basis of your prior academic work, probability of success in your chosen curriculum, and certification of adequate financial resources.

Transfer credit from other countries

Transfer credit may be awarded for *university-level studies* completed abroad, based on the official school records and certificates you submit with your application. Credit for previous academic work completed outside the United States is evaluated on an individual basis. When you are accepted for admission, advanced credit is awarded based upon the postsecondary records submitted. If advanced credit is not granted, credit may be earned by validation for comparable courses through departmental examinations, successful completion of higher level courses, or acceptable recommendations. Syllabi, course descriptions, and test results may be required to facilitate the evaluation. You should bring these documents with you. Evaluations may be delayed until after you enroll. Final determination of the amount of academic credit awarded will not be made until after you are admitted to the university.

Health insurance

Kansas State University strongly recommends that all international students and their dependents be covered by health insurance. If insurance is not supplied by a sponsor or agency, you can purchase it on arrival. Health insurance should be maintained during your entire stay at Kansas State University.
