The International Baccalaureate subject test is one way to earn college credit by exam.

If you achieved IB test scores that are eligible for K-State credit, you can request a score report be provided to K-State.

How to request a score report

Look up the exam subject, locate your level and score, and see how the credit transfers. For example: if you took the H-level biology exam and scored a 7, your grade for K-State's Principles of Biology will be an A.

You must complete a minimum number of university general education (UGE) credit hours at K-State. IB hours may be considered "transfer credits" for purposes of the UGE policy. Consult your advisor.

K-State considers completion of the International Baccalaureate Diploma to be equivalent to a U.S. high school diploma. Contact the Office of Admissions for details about admission requirements.
