Cynthia Burack is associate professor in the Department of Women's Studies at The Ohio State University. Burack received her Ph.D. in political theory and political psychology from the Department of Government and Politics at the University of Maryland. Before moving to Ohio State, she taught political science and women's studies at The George Washington University and at the University of Florida. Burack's research in social theory and political philosophy focuses on leadership, cooperation, group conflict, the importance of communication in groups and institutions, and the cooperative and productive potential of groups. In addition to her teaching and research, Burack has lectured on race and gender and has conducted workshops on workforce diversity issues for federal government offices and professional organizations.
