

## DAAD Scholarship OR Fellowship

<b>Purpose</b>	DAAD stands for <i>Deutscher Akademischer Austausch Dienst</i> aka <i>German Academic Exchange Service</i> . Their goal is to promote study and research in Germany (at all levels of higher education) and to build international academic ties thereby.
<b>Award</b>	
<i>Tenable</i>	For study in Germany.
<i>Number &amp; Amount</i>	Consult the website. Most options fund most of the trip.
<i>Duration</i>	Many different awards offered (see below). Two months to multiple years.
<b>Eligibility</b>	
<i>Who</i>	US or Canadian citizen. Options for international students studying in the US also exist. Options for undergrads and graduate students. Sophomore and up. Almost all majors are eligible for one or more scholarship options.
<i>When</i>	Depends on when you plan to study abroad (and which award you will seek).
<i>Selection Criteria</i>	Different awards require different language levels (ranging from none to fluent). Program should fit academic and career goals. No other criteria stated. A defined interest in Germany or some aspect thereof is probably helpful.
<b>Campus Deadline</b>	None.
<b>Deadline</b>	Depends on scholarship option. Deadlines range across the year. Plan ahead.
<b>Application</b>	Also depends on scholarship option.

No prior German is required.</p> <p>The DAAD Study and Internship option offers both academic and work experience in Germany.
