Purpose	One way in which Phi Kappa Phi supports its mission to recognize and promote academic excellence in all fields of higher education. To honor top students among the ranks of Phi Kappa Phi. Established in 1932.
Award	
<i>Tenable</i>	<i>Preferably at an accredited American institution of higher learning.</i> For the pursuit of a graduate or professional degree.
<i>Number & Amount</i>	60 PKP Fellowships. \$5000. Also 40 <i>Awards of Excellence</i> for \$2000 each.
<i>Duration</i>	First year of graduate or professional school only.
Eligibility	
<i>Who</i>	Member of Phi Kappa Phi (or selected for initiation).
<i>When</i>	Typically in the final undergraduate semester (or semester after for December graduates). Students cannot have earned more than eight hours of graduate credit, so alumni/graduate students might seek nomination in some instances.
<i>Selection Criteria</i>	Typically 3.9 GPA or higher. Scholarly ability and promise. Leadership and extracurriculars. Strong letters of reference. Clear goals. Credible applicant for top programs in your field of study. Strong test scores (such as GRE or LSAT).
Campus Deadline	January or February. Each chapter can nominate ONE individual.
Deadline	March 1.
Application	Application form with resume information. Personal statement. Standardized test scores. Three letters of reference (with specific form). Transcripts. Campus nomination.
