

Herbert Scoville Jr. Peace Fellowship

Purpose	To provide <i>college graduates with the opportunity to gain a Washington perspective on key issues of peace and security</i> and to commemorate the efforts of Mr. Scoville in regards to nuclear arms control.
Award	
<i>Tenable</i>	Placement at various DC-based organizations interested in peace and security issues (see website for specifics).
<i>Number & Amount</i>	Average of five or six per year (two or three per application cycle). Stipend of \$2,200/month plus health and insurance and travel expense to DC.
<i>Duration</i>	Six months typically.
Eligibility	
<i>Who</i>	US citizen (preferred) or non-citizen living within the U.S. Any major so long as the student has a background in peace/security issues.
<i>When</i>	Graduating seniors, graduate students or recent alumni may apply.
<i>Selection Criteria</i>	<i>Excellent academic accomplishments and a strong interest in issues of peace and security. A record that reflects the substantive focus of the fellowship</i> but prior peace/security experience is not essential.
Campus Deadline	None.
Deadline	Two deadlines per year. October for Spring placement. February for Fall.
Application	Cover sheet. Letter of interest. CV. Personal essay that includes placement preferences. 1000 word essay on a contemporary peace/security issue. Transcripts. Two letters of reference. Finalist interview.
