



# Mac OS X Reader

If you use an Apple computer, you do not need to install a reader. A text-to-speech reader is built into the operating system and recent updates to the operating system have greatly improved the voices. Do the following to use the built in text reader on Mac OS X:

- Open **system preferences**.
- Select "**Speech**," with the icon of a microphone.
- Near the top of the window that appears will be two choices "Speech Recognition" and "Text to Speech." **Select "Text to Speech."**
- Select your **system voice** (DSS recommends Alex) and rate.
- Check the box next to "**Speak selected text when the key is pressed**" and set a key combination. DSS recommends Control+Shift+R.
- With everything set you can close out the windows and use the reader. To read text select it and press the key combination that you set up in the preferences.
