Alpha Rho Chapter Announces Major Endowment Fund Drive

Since 1992, when the Epsilon Sigma Phi Endowment Fund was created, 37 grants for a total of \$18,697 have been awarded for program innovation and professional development. The dollar amount awarded each year depends on the amount of interest earned on the Endowment Fund principal, held with the KSU Foundation. In 1999, seven projects were awarded grants for a total of \$3,475. Grant amounts ranged from \$250 to \$750.

We are ready to announce a major endowment fund drive to add another \$45,000 to our current principal of \$55,000 so that \$100,000 will be available to eam interest and the number of grants awarded double.

The following events will be held through annual conference of this year to help raise the \$45,000.

A payroll deduction contribution.

A trip to Williamsburg, VA April 22-29, 2001 or a week s stay in Branson, MO, May 26 -June 2, 2001.

Two football tickets for the College of Agriculture Skybox at the November 4 game.

Live auction during the Epsilon Sigma Phi dinner at annual conference. Items already pledged for the auction include: jelly basket, honey, stained glass piece, jewelry, polar fleece stadium blanket with Go Cats embroidering, K-State Research and Extension tote, and a wooden cheese board. An important part of the endowment fund drive is the opportunity for Extension retirees, professionals, staff, and friends to make a cash contribution or pledge. Letters were sent in June and contributions are being received.

From September 1991 to June 1992, pledges of \$60,000 were received. The committee's goal is to raise the fund to \$100,000 which should generate approximately \$10,000 for grants annually. The campaign for payroll deductions and cash gifts will generate a major portion of those funds.

For current employees a pledge of \$500 could be completed with a bi-weekly payroll deduction of \$3.85 for five years and a pledge of \$1000 could be completed with a bi-weekly deduction of \$7.70 for five years.

Pledges and gifts from the 1991 - 1992 campaign will be added to new pledges and gifts for the following recognition levels:

communicate and promote opportunities available to members.

Promote the engaged institution concept to Extension professionals and others in the university systems.

Promote enhanced collaborative efforts with JCEP partners to benefit the partnering organizations and their members.

Initiate planning for Epsilon Sigma Phi s 75th anniversary celebration at Galaxy II.

Review the ESP Chapter Handbook for potential revisions for clarity and usefulness.

Why Do We Need A Dues Increase?

At the July 6, 2000 Epsilon Sigma Phi board meeting, the board approved the following: In order to offset the national dues increase of \$10.00 and to address inflationary concerns, the Epsilon Sigma Phi Council recommends that active member dues be increased from the current \$35.00 to \$50.00 if paid by November 1 and to \$55.00 if paid after November 1.

This newsletter is the official notice of the proposed dues change which will be voted on and discussed by the membership at the ESP business meeting during Annual Conference.

The Resource Management Committee composed of Fred DeLano, past treasurer; Stacey Warner, current treasurer; and current members Margaret Phillips, Angela DeVore and Libby Curry met twice by phone to develop a recommendation based on membership trends, account balances over the past few years and cash flow. That recommendation was presented to the ESP Council who after extensive consideration of the dues issue made the above recommendations.

Following is information that may be helpful to the membership as you consider a dues increase:

What are our current dues and what is being proposed?

Current Dues Structure:

*Active members - \$35.00 (\$20.00 goes to national)

*Associate members - \$15.00 (no national affiliation for those with less than 5 years of Extension employment)

*Life members - \$175.00 one-time payment (\$100 goes to national. The Alpha Rho Chapter constitution specifies that the life dues will be five times the active member dues.)

Proposed Dues:

*Active member - \$50.00 before Nov 1

*Active member - \$55.00 after Nov 1 (National dues will increase to \$30.00 January 1, 2001 so this proposed increase includes the \$10.00 national increase plus an additional \$5.00 to the Alpha Rho chapter budget).

*Associate members - \$20.00

* Life members - \$250.00 one time (National life member dues will increase to \$150.)

Why is there a proposed differential between dues paid before November 1 and after November 1?

This past year, dues had to be mailed to the national office by March 1, 2000. For 2001, dues will be delinquent if not received in the national office by January 1, 2001. Offering an incentive to have dues paid before the end of December will help us meet the January 1 deadline. The number of voting delegates on the national level is based on dues paid by the deadline so it is in the best interest of the Alpha Rho chapter to be on time.

How long has it been since the last dues increase?

Dues were last increased in 1993 to reflect a national dues increase.

Why did the national organization raise dues?

Information received from the national organization states: The dues structure has not changed since 1993. At the same time, a number of increases in costs have been realized by the national office - increases in travel costs, technology equipment and maintenance in order to better serve the state chapters, increases in financial aid for professional development, and an expanded role for ESP in building support for the Cooperative Extension system. Thus, your national board felt it important to review the dues structure in order to continue to meet the goals of the organization.

What benefits do I receive by belonging to Epsilon Sigma Phi?

Since 1994, \$15,500 in scholarship loans have been granted to members of the Alpha Rho chapter.

\$300 is available each year for a travel scholarship for a member.

Numerous peer recognition awards are presented to members each year at the annual meeting including the Friend of Extension, Distinguished Service, Horizon, Early Career, Mid Career, Team and Meritorious Service.

Professional Development Workshops are periodically held for the benefit of all Extension faculty.

The affiliated Epsilon Sigma Phi Endowment Fund has awarded \$18,697 in grants since 1992 to Extension faculty.

Alpha Rho Chapter Constitution and By-Law Proposed Changes (Bold faced text indicates proposed change)

Constitution

Article III, paragraph 2

Satisfactory service shall be determined by the **Recruitment and Retention** *standing membership* committee.

Article V, paragraph 1

The officers of this association shall consist of a president, vice-president, secretary, **historian**, *annalist* treasurer, and editor, who shall be elected at large and shall also serve as members of the executive board. The officers shall be elected annually at the annual meeting of the Alpha Rho Chapter and shall serve until their successors are elected and qualify.

Bylaws

Article VI

Section 2. VICE-PRESIDENT. In the absence or disability of the president, the vice-president shall preside and perform the duties of the president. In the case of death or resignation of the president, the vice-president shall succeed the president and serve until the next annual meeting. The vice-president is the president-elect and shall succeed the president at the annual meeting.

Article VI

Section 3. SECRETARY. The secretary shall: (a) Keep the complete record of the meetings of the Alpha

Rho Chapter and the executive board.

(b) Serve all notices required by the constitution and bylaws.

(c) Submit to the annual meeting of the Alpha Rho Chapter of Epsilon Sigma Phi a complete report of the year's activities of the chapter, except Such special reports as are presented by the treasurer and committees.

(d) Notify candidates for membership of their election.
(d) Furnish each newly elected and initiated member a copy of the obligation creed and constitution of Epsilon Sigma Phi and a membership card.

(e) Perform such other duties as may be required by the board of directors and/or the members of the Alpha Rho Chapter.

Section 4. HISTORIAN ANNALIST. The historian

annalist shall maintain a member profile database. The historian shall also archive the annual report, the banquet program, minutes from council and board meetings and membership records each year.

Section 7. COUNCIL DIRECTORS. The directors shall attend Council meetings. **They help plan, organize and encourage the membership to participate**, *on call, to help plan, organize, and encourage participation by the membership* in the work of Alpha Rho Chapter. They will serve the chapter membership in their respective segments, and assist the officers in such tasks as contacting prospective members, collecting dues, such suggesting nominations for awards, and supporting committee activities.

Article VII

Section 2. STANDING COMMITTEES

(a)(a) Each Standing Committee will consi(a) Each Standing Commbers with terms being two years in length. Associate members are eligible for committee membership.

(b) A Standing Committee may organize subcommittees to help carry out its responsibilities.

(c) Representation from county, area, and state staff is encouraged on each committee, geographically dispersed throughout the state. Retiree involvement is encouraged on all of the committees.

(d) New members are appointed each year by the President within one (1) month following the annual meeting.

(e) The committee Vice-Chair will become the Chair the following year with a new Vice-Chair appointed by the President.

(f) Each committee will have a board member that serves as liaison. Committee chairs are encouraged to attend the State Council meetings.

(g) The committee chair is responsible to provide a budget proposal to the Chapter Treasurer.

(g) The professional improvement committee shall seek ways to promote and recognize professionalism within Extension through loans, grants, and scholarships.
