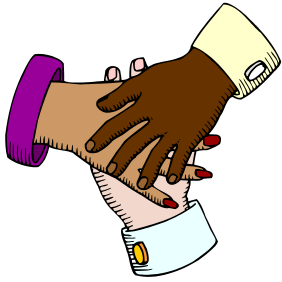
- **Choose a vision bigger than ourselves.** I can choose to see our situation as a shrinking pie or as a limitless sky. I choose the latter.

Applications are being accepted until **August 15** for the next round of grants.

Program innovation grants are to be for programming that is new, can be replicated and is timely and relevant to the mission of K-State Research and Extension.

Professional development grants can be used for attendance at the National ESP Conference, for graduate studies or for other innovative professional development opportunities.

In recent years grants funded have ranged from \$200 to \$3500.

A total of \$85,765 has been awarded to Alpha Rho Chapter members since 1992.

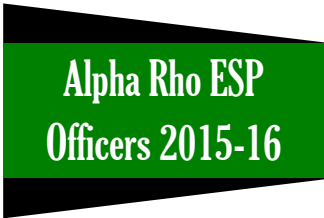


ESP ENDOWMENT FUND UPDATE: CHARITABLE IRA ROLLOVER NOW PERMANENT!

In late 2015, Congress and the President approved legislation that made this highly popular charitable giving option a permanent part of the tax code. The Charitable IRA Rollover provision allows IRA owners, age 70 ½ and older, to make direct tax-free withdrawals of up to \$100,000 from their IRA’s to charity. **Obviously, Charitable IRA Rollovers offer the potential for very tax efficient charitable giving.** Because of the age requirements, (70 ½ and older), we will send a much more detailed explanation of the benefits and rules regarding Charitable IRA Rollovers to our ESP life members.

IN THE BEGINNING-1930....DOUG JARDINE, CHAPTER HISTORIAN

In the Sound of Music, Julie Andrews sang, "Let's start at the very beginning, a very good place to start." So, for this installment of Alpha Rho history, we are going to set the "Way Back Machine" to the year **1930**.

The Alpha Rho Chapter of Epsilon Sigma Phi was chartered on **March 21, 1930** with eight Charter Organizers. They were, Dean Harry Umberger, Del-fa Hazeltine, A.L. Clapp, L.C. Williams, Floyd Pattison, M.H. Coe, E.G. Kelly, and Amy Kelly.

The charter was actually held open until the fall annual conference since so many field agents were unable to make it to campus for the initial initiation.

At the first Annual Banquet, held on **October 26th** in the Crystal Room of the Wareham Hotel, another 23 members were inducted as charter members bringing the total to 31.

The Alpha Rho Chapter became the **42nd chapter**, being chartered shortly after Alabama.

In the program, the following was identified as the purpose of Epsilon Sigma Phi: **The purpose of this organization is to maintain the ideals, preserve the traditions, uphold the morale of the Cooperative Extension Service, and develop the spirit of fraternity among the members.**

The program consisted of several songs by Miss Hilda Grossman, a talk on The Russian Agricultural Program by Dr. P.L. Gainey, Initiation, Business Meeting, and lastly, **card playing!**

The entrée for the banquet was Filet Mignon and dinner music was provided by Collegiate 4-H.

The first officers were: Dean of the House of Pioneers, H. Umberger, Chief, L.C. Williams, Sec'y-Treas, Amy Kelly and Analyst, E.G. Kelly.

Dues included a \$5.00 initiation fee and 50¢ collected annually for the national organization. Local dues were not to be decided until the closing of the charter.

In the national newsletter from that year, it was highlighted that W.D. Bently, Assistant Director of Extension in Oklahoma, received the second Ruby Award for Distinguished Service.

In the biography, it noted that Dr. Bentley worked closely with **Seaman A. Knapp** in establishing cooperative demonstration work for boll weevil eradication in Texas.
