## 5. 22-23 Committee work – continuing into 23-24

A. Micro-credentialing – update

Global campus and others involved are working to make a form on Curriculog and once that's completed, they will circulate it with the working group to get feedback. Both Kliewer and Saucier are involved in those discussions to share a faculty perspective. Bennett shared that he has been contacted by other institutions to get ideas on how to do this as they felt KSU was a good model.

- B. Undergraduate Post Bacc minors in general should these continue No comments.
- C. Interdisciplinary program Policy review Kliewer reported this will be picked up in fall.
- D. Follett follow up discussion of proposed process

Kliewer shared there continues to be some concern surrounding the proposal from Follett and the pilot moving forward that was discussed at a recent meeting. There seems to be indication that Salina, Manhattan, an Olathe may all be involved with this. It isn't clear who is approving this within administration and what role Faculty Senate has in the process, though several committees have received a presentation. Adams reported that the Library faculty are working on a resolution in opposition to this current proposal from Follett and he'll hopefully share more soon. That document may include contextual information regarding how their proposal impacts the textbook affordability program, faculty being able to publish through KREX, and also the amount of data being collected from students and how that will be used. There was reference to an older resolution from Faculty Senate. Kliewer will also keep members apprised from any other information he receives.

E. Changing course components (which ones may be expedited?) No discussion.

## 6. New Business

A. Proposed change to University Library Committee Charge

A proposal has come forward from the University Library committee, regarding their data sheet. They wish to update their charge and also provide more structure around leadership roles. A motion was made by Kliewer and seconded by Douthit to approve the proposed change to the University Library's committee data sheet. Motion carried.

  - Senators Bennett and Kliewer are willing to continue in these roles, with the committee's approval. No additional interest was conveyed at this time.
