 - A. Micro-credentialing University Handbook language (new)
 As noted above, there is a workgroup beginning to work on this. It was inquired if anyone from Extension was included. This will be followed up on.
 - B. Interdisciplinary program Policy review No new information.
 - C. Follett Inclusive Access Program pilot (guests will discuss at September Faculty Senate meeting) There was good discussion at the September FS meeting. Berney shared that she has been contacted as well by VP Lane, Director Williamson, and others regarding the comments she shared about her role at the libraries of obtaining textbooks. We will continue to monitor this and provide updates as they become available.
 - D. Undergraduate Post Bacc minors in general future of these Binkley is beginning to do a little research on the number of these and is working with the Registrar's office to obtain a list.
 - E. <u>Course components</u> which changes can be expedited?
 - Determine which changes to components should be processed through standard routing and which may be expedited. Component definitions were updated in 2019. At that time, AAC wished to have more time to determine if certain changes could be expedited. Since that time, there has been a lack of consistency applied to processing these changes.

A. CAPP (Committee on Academic Policies and Procedures) – Kliewer

Kliewer shared that a first reading of a business process for approving retro conferral graduation requests was discussed in CAPP. Though this is a business process, it was determined it is prudent to have it come to FSAAC after CAPP for endorsement as it directly relates to part of Faculty Senate's role in approving candidates for degrees. It was noted that faculty are still involved in approving the requirements for degrees and that truly sets the framework for those degree audits.

B. Curriculog Team

Though there is no official report, this team has been hard at work and Ms. LaBerge commended all those on the Registrar's team who have worked so hard on getting new forms up and going in Curriculog and for hosting Curriculog open help sessions. They have offered to do so in October as well since it appears that may be when more questions arise.

C. Library – Grant Alford They will meet next week for the first time this semester. 11. Announcements and/or for the good of the University

The Town Hall will be on Friday at 9 am in the McVay Town Hall and also streamed live.

Bennett shared that A&S will be approving their program requirements and these will come to this committee for approval. They may be a little out of the normal from what this committee is used to seeing, but it was clarified these are not "college requirements," which would be in conflict with the KBOR outline of what is allowable for the gen ed core, but rather these are "program requirements," and it was noted there are other colleges working on these as well, and they are allowable.
