



	students have the ability to create actionable activities that generate interest
	to drive sales. These skills are relevant to any industry or company that
	hires our students. Yet, sports and entertainment provide an opportunity to
	teach these skills in an area that students find engaging. Beyond student's
	interests, the industry offers aspects applicable to many organizations
	giving students a firm foundation in quantitative analysis and marketing
	strategy implementation.

As in many industries, but especially in entertainment, the business models are constantly evolving resulting from technological innovations and global influences. It has seen a greater increase use of user-generated content that competes with and in some cases compliments industry standard bearers. Paramount to the industry is the need to generate new marketing strategies that create valuable partnerships and revenue streams. Other industries are seeing these effects escalate and thus, demonstrate a further need for students to adapt these influences.

The entertainment industry also has distinct diffusion patterns, where sales often peak in the first period and decay rapidly in later periods. Emphasis on driving sales is unique especially as products are distinctive and consumers typically consume them only once as for instance live performances. Many times managers often manage multiple new events at the same time with emphasis on gaining a profit. With the advances in technology, increasing marketing communications, and extensive competitive alternatives for leisure and non-leisure activities, there is an even greater need for strategic marketing focus.

The purpose of the entertainment marketing course is to advance students' knowledge of strategic marketing in the context of a challenging, rapidly changing environment. The course focuses on the film, music, and performance arts of the entertainment industry while other facets of the industry including television, museums, theme parks, video games, and publishing share similar industry characteristics. Students mastering the course learning objectives of assessing market opportunity, developing marketing strategies, and designing implementation tactics will is likely to succeed in any industry.

The course complements the current department's Sports Marketing course and beyond offering marketing students another needed elective, it could be another option for the College of Business students, who have an interest in entertainment. More importantly, however, the course content is likely to be of interest to students from other colleges. For instance, students from Human Ecology's Restaurant and Hotel Management or Arts and Science's Music, Theater, and Dance, in particular may wish augment their degree with knowledge about business marketing.

Finally, no Kansas Regents or Big 12 university offers a business course in Entertainment Marketing. If taught, it is from the perspective of journalism or mass communication. The proposed course uniquely positions the College from other colleges and universities potentially driving enrollment.
