Undergraduate students graduating from our program often lack in-depth knowledge of meat science and muscle biology. Many students are taking this course to meet a K-State 8 requirement in Natural and Physical Sciences, but have no real interest in the technical subject matter. Students also opt to take this course because the prerequisite requirement is only MATH 150 and typically not an issue for KSU students to meet. The technical content of this course is important for CE majors and several other majors that use land surveying in the typical practice in their area of interest. Students must be exposed to modern surveying techniques using state-of-the-art equipment to be prepared to enter the workplace. Survey equipment is expensive and in order to have a hands-on experience, either more surveying equipment needs to be purchased or more lab sections need to be taught to limit the number of students per lab section. Either of these solutions have a financial impact on the Department and outweigh the benefit of having this course listed as a K-State 8 course. Students have many other options to meet this K-State 8 requirement in the Natural and Physical Sciences. Many of these other courses can be delivered in a more cost-effective manner.

## Rationale

Change course number. This is an introductory course to political thought. Political Science has four core introductory courses, U.S. Politics (POLSC 113), Introduction to Comparative Politics (POLSC 135), Introduction to Political Thought (POLSC 301), and World Politics (POLSC 333). These are the core required courses in our major (3 of 4). They are all offered at the same level of instruction. We'd like this to be reflected in their numbering. As they currently stand, the difference in level across these introductory courses produces confusion among our majors and among students outside our major. Most importantly, these courses are developed to be taken by freshmen and sophomores. The University Handbook, section F51, stipulates that courses targeted to students at that level be at the 100-299 course numbering. We are currently out of compliance with the handbook. We are also removing the prerequisite that students be of sophomore standing to take this course. There are no prerequisites.
