Addresses current topics such as personal privacy, cryptocurrency and blockchain. Students interact with selected cryptographic machines, codes, hand-techniques and computer products developed since the beginning of writing.

#### Rationale and Impact (NEW)

Rationale\*

This course will expand electives for Polytechnic students in a current topic that is relevant for students. Cryptography is a maturing science that has broad-ranging applications in business, government and personal activities. Every commercial establishment that either markets its products internationally or uses computer networks for global communications and customer services must be concerned with protecting its assets and customers' information from a variety of attacks. This concern increases when the internet is the primary communications medium. The most cost-

effective protection for information transmitted by or stored in computers is cryptography.

The well-informed company (or individual concerned with personal privacy) recognizes the value that cryptography adds to the security of its computer information assets. Facebook privacy, cryptocurrency, blockchain, and the Internet of Things (IoT) are all current issues that have cryptography at their core and are covered in this course.

Impact Statement (i.e. if this impacts another unit)\*

No other colleges or K-State academic units will be affected by this request. Confirmed by conference call on 16 April 2018 with Dr. George Amariucai. Dr Amariucai teaches CIS 753 & CIS 553, which are both heavily math oriented and the only cryptography courses presently taught at KSU. He had no objection to KSUP offering COT 490 as an undergraduate elective. He understood / agreed that COT 490 was a practical hands-on course with different mission objectives and deployment techniques.

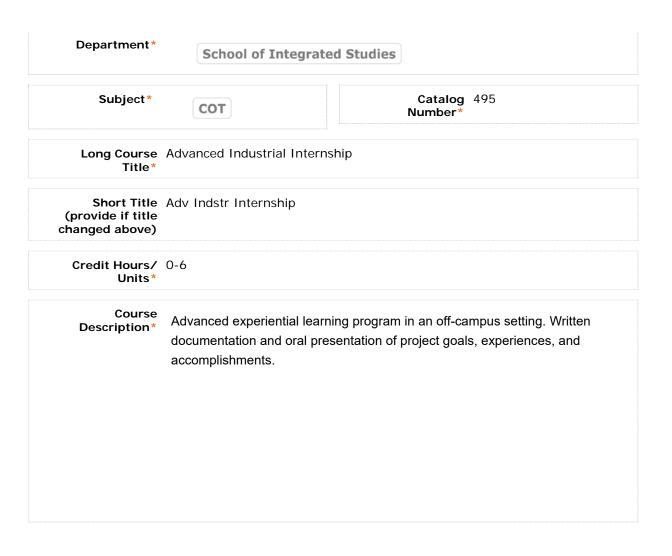

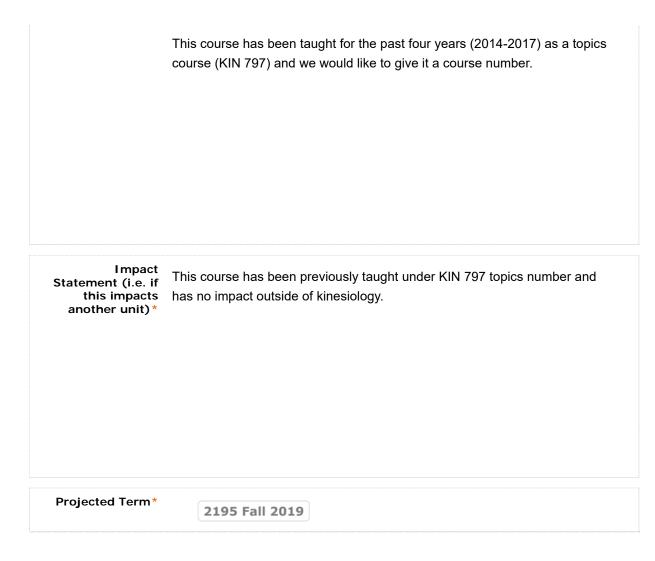
