1. Provides opportunities of summative and formative question and assessment
2. H5P, Native, WeBWork, Canvas QTI questions can be pulled into the libre text quizzes in bulk.
3. New API is available allowing to for communication with existing canvas software at K-State. The API provides more access to data compare to LTI.
4. Zero cost for Libretext
5. Libre text is considered a non-profit program
6. The whole state of Kansas Board of Regents institutions are moving to becoming a Libre text
7. How is cost delivered to students? It is more institutional based rather than each student
 - a. Can be paid at a program, department, college level to license all
 - b. \$10 per student/ per semester
 - i. No matter the number of courses the student uses this platform for.
 - ii. If multiple courses in a speciality use it, it provides more bang for the buck.

 - a. It is a big lift, if from scratch
 - b. Platform allows templates and other items are already built. To help reduce the amount of effort.

b. Failure Throttling Feature of CAS- Scott Finkeldei & Michael Raine

- i. Recently turned on an additional security feature to recognize failed password attempts.
- ii. It prevents bulk password attempts
 1. 2 password attempts in less than 3 seconds identifies these attempts as a bad actor and cyberattack.
 2. Human action would be much slower. ~7secs for 2 password attempts.
 3. Bad actors use a flood technique to overwhelm and slow down the system then try to filter through the system.
 4. Need was identified to use this system after the huge attack earlier this semester.
 5. Operational security choice from central IT in a direct response from an active attack at K-State.
