• Kansas Health Matters

The Kansas Health Matters website brings community health-related statistical data, local resources and a wealth of information to one, accessible, user-friendly location. The intent is to give our communities the tools they need to read and understand the public health indicators that affect the quality of our residents' lives. The tools help the community set goals and evaluate progress.

- <u>Kansas Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System</u> The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), which is coordinated and partially funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, is the largest continuously conducted telephone survey in the world. It is conducted in every state, the District of Columbia, and several United States territories.
- <u>Kansas Information for Communities</u>
 A health information portal where you can query public health datasets, access statistics for Kansas counties, and find links to public health reports.
- <u>Kansas Annual Summary of Vital Statistics</u>
 Public health informatics for statistical information and links to annual summary reports, vital events.
- <u>Kansas Environmental Public Health Tracking</u>
 Environmental public health tracks the causes of chronic diseases that are hard to identify such as measuring amounts of hazardous substances in the environment, tracing the spread of these over time and areas.
- <u>Kansas Behavioral Health Indicators Dashboard</u>
 Compilation of 10 state and national data sources ranging from KBI, KDHE, KDADS, KS Dept. of Education, transportation, American Community Survey, National Survey on Drug Use
- <u>Kansas County Situation & Trends Reports</u>
 County reports incorporating social, demographic and economic data to provide a comprehensive view of local conditions and trends that aid in Extension planning, community and business leaders.
- <u>Kansas Rural Health Works</u> Reports, prepared by the Office of Local Government, K-State Research & Extension, show the contribution the health care system makes to providing local jobs and income in many rural communities.
- <u>Kansas Agricultural Statistics</u>
 Timely, and useful statistics with searchable database for Kansas agricultural information
- <u>Kansas Kids Count</u>
 Provides an annual snapshot of how Kansas children are doing when compared to their peers on the national, state and county levels.
- <u>Kansas Communities that Care</u>
 Youth survey has been administered annually free of charge throughout the state since 1994. The survey tracks teen use of harmful substances such as alcohol, tobacco and other drugs.
- <u>Kansas Child Well-Being Indicators</u>
 Prevention, protection, economic and employment data for vulnerable children.

 The County Summaries use empirical data from Kansas Farm Management Association (KFMA) member farms for each county with sufficient available data.
