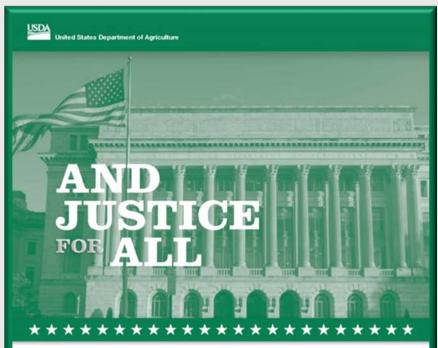

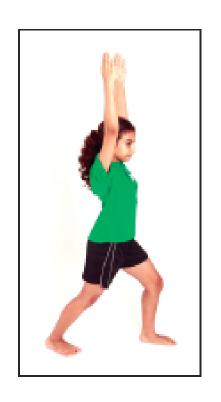

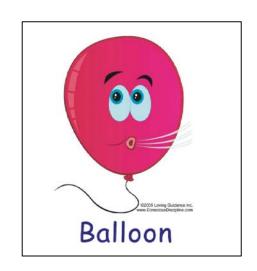




















Build Family Resilience:

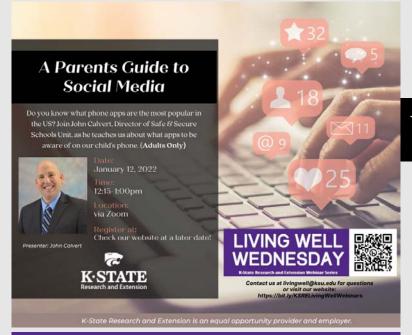
