

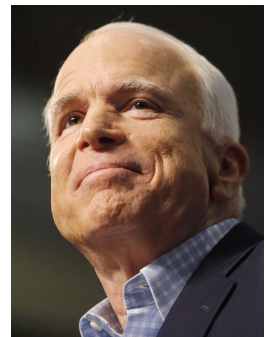
Election Watch '08
