Graduate Program Directors

Important Testing Update from the GRE, TOEFL, and IELTS Programs

ETS and the Chinese National Education Examinations Authority (NEEA) have canceled all GRE® and TOEFL® test administrations in Mainland China through the end of February. This is due to concern for the health and safety of our test takers and test center staff in response to the escalation on January 26, 2020, to a Level One Public Health Emergency Response by the Provincial Governments in China. ETS has also suspended test administrations in Hong Kong through February 16, 2020. At this time, test administrations in all other locations will take place as scheduled. hat all colleges and universities understand that this delay is through no fault of the test taker. ETS is closely following national and local developments and will alert institutions if there are any significant changes.

The IELTS Partners are monitoring the Coronavirus situation very closely and are taking relevant measures to protect the health of test takers and colleagues in affected areas, in line with the advice of national healthcare authorities.

- All IELTS and IELTS for UKVI tests are currently suspended in China, Hong Kong SAR and Macau SAR:
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ Mainland China tests currently suspended until 1 March, 2020 $\,$
 - Macau tests currently suspended until 11 February, 2020
 - Hong Kong tests currently suspended until 17 February, 2020
- These dates will be reviewed as the situation develops.
- Transfers and refunds are available for affected test takers by contacting their test center by email.
- There may be an increase in test session availability as soon as testing can resume.
- Visit the <u>IELTS website</u> for further developments in IELTS test arrangements.

Unfortunately, many test takers in these locations will be delayed in sitting a test and subsequently sending their GRE, TOEFL, or IELTS scores to institutions. Colleges and universities are asked to understand that this delay is through is through no fault of the test taker. Institutions are encouraged to extend the application process for these applicants.

Effect of Testing Suspensions on KSU Graduate Programs

Currently, international graduate applications are open for the Spring 2021 semester, for which the deadline is Aug. 1st. If graduate recruitment in your program will be affected by testing suspensions, such as delays in testing and

reporting of scores, please contact the Graduate School, so that we can consider requests for deadline extensions on a case-by-case basis. The Graduate School will make every effort to be flexible for the impacted applicants subjected to the fact that the admitted students should have sufficient time to make interview appointments at the embassies, to get their visas, travel to the U.S. on time for orientations, and get on payroll, if applicable.

The Graduate School is accepting nominations for two graduate students in STEMrelated fields to attend the <u>AAAS Catalyzing Advocacy in Science and Engineering</u> (<u>CASE</u>) workshop March 29-April 1 in Washington, DC. To nominate a student, the graduate program director or department chair must provide a short — approximately 100 words — paragraph on why they are nominating the student. The student also must provide a short — approximately 100 word — paragraph addressing why he or she would like to attend the workshop, what they expect to gain from the experience, and how it would fit into their career plans, as well as a short CV. <u>Complete a brief form to indicate the iBT TOEFL to be used for your</u> <u>graduate program</u>

Educational Testing Service (ETS) is now providing individuals who take the iBT TOEFL two scores: the score for the current test and MyBest[™] Score which is composed of the highest scores from each sub-section (reading, listening, speaking, and writing) from all of the test taker's valid iBT TOEFL scores from tests taken in the last two years. The Graduate Council approved the following policy at their December meeting: Graduate Programs may use MyBest[™] Score or the most recent iBT TOEFL in assessing language proficiency for admissions of international students. Programs must determine which score to use and apply it consistently for all applicants. This policy change is effective for all international applicants admitted for **Spring 2020 and thereafter**.

To assist the Graduate School with processing recommendations for admission, we ask that each graduate program **complete a brief form** to indicate which iBT TOEFL score should be used to evaluate international applicants to your program.

Nominate Graduate Students for Alumni Association Awards

Each year, the K-State Alumni Association recognizes K-State students for their accomplishments through several awards. The Alumni Association is now accepting nominations for the following 2020 awards programs:

- The <u>Graduate Student Awards</u> recognize one graduate student in two categories: academics, and leadership and service (two awards).
- The <u>International Leadership Awards</u> honor four graduating students for their leadership within the international community (four awards).
- The <u>Robinson Family Multicultural Leadership Awards</u> honor four graduating students for their leadership within the multicultural community (four awards).
- The <u>Tony Jurich Community Commitment and Leadership Student</u> <u>Awards</u> recognize one graduate student and one undergraduate student who demonstrate a commitment to community leadership and service through Jurich's Core Leadership Tenets (two awards).

Students graduating in May, August, or December (2020) are eligible for the awards. Recipients are selected by committees of the Alumni Association board of directors. Winners will be recognized April 22 and 23 at the K-State Alumni Center. **Nominations are due February 7**.

The Graduate School is accepting nominations for the Timothy R. Donoghue Graduate Scholarships for the 2020-2021 academic year

This scholarship program was initiated by Timothy Donoghue, former Graduate School dean, as a way to recruit top candidates throughout the United States to K-State graduate programs by offering graduate assistantship packages that are highly competitive. Donoghue Scholarships enhance the maximum package a graduate program can offer to top candidates, making the total package a partnership between the graduate program and the Graduate School. Funding is available for the 2020-2021 academic year to support a maximum of 10 masters and 20 doctoral applicants. The scholarship is renewable for a second academic year. This hands-on workshop introduces the features of citation management tools so participants starting their research can select the tool that will work best for them. Participants will create an account in Zotero in order to learn common steps for organizing citations and creating bibliographies. Computers will be provided but participants are encouraged to bring their own laptops to get set up on their computer. After attending the webinar, you'll be able to define User Experience (UX) Research; determine if this

<u>Complete the KSN application by February 15 to be considered for</u> <u>K-State scholarships</u>

Graduate students are encouraged to complete the K-State Scholarship Network (KSN) application to be considered for scholarship opportunities. Students will create a profile in the system that will help match them to specific scholarship opportunities provided by K-State donors and offered through university departments. Scholarship opportunities are available for incoming and continuing students. To be considered for scholarships, students must **complete the KSN application by February 15 each year**. Accepting Applications for Sarachek Predoctoral Honors Fellowship and Travel Awards

The Graduate School is accepting applications for the Sarachek Predoctoral Honors Fellowship and Travel Awards in Molecular Biology. The fellowship provides an award of \$17,000 to assist with the recipient's transition to the next stage of his or her career. Additionally, up to three Sarachek Scientific Travel Awards of \$1,000 each may be awarded annually. These awards are intended to recognize exceptional achievement in scholastics and research. Students must show evidence of effective communication of research results through publications in leading journals and presentations at national and international meetings. In order to be eligible, a student must have completed preliminary exams, been admitted to candidacy, and their research must rely significantly on one or more contemporary molecular biological techniques.
