Graduate School Commencement Update

As reported in the Special Issue of K-State Today on Friday, November 6th and again on Monday, November 9th, significant changes are being made in the commencement ceremonies due to the current and projected surge in statewide COVID-19 cases and strain on medical resources throughout the state of Kansas and elsewhere in the U.S. One of these changes includes no family members or guests in attendance. This means that faculty cannot attend the ceremony to support their graduate students.

I hope you will celebrate with your graduate(s) in another safe and meaningful ways and will join their family and friends and watch them be recognized during the ceremony on the livestream available on the https://www.k-state.edu/graduation/.

The deadlines to officially graduate in December remain the same as published on the Graduate School Commencement and Graduation Calendar.

Graduate Students

ATTENTION: Graduate Students Appointed as Graduate Assistant (GTA, GRA, or GA) for spring semester

The Registrar's Office has established **November 20th** for graduate students on a minimum of 0.4 graduate assistantship (GTA, GRA, GA or combination) to enroll for spring semester. This will allow the Registrar's Office time to process the waiver so graduate assistant's tuition is assessed at the resident rate or GTA tuition is paid for hours specified in the Graduate Handbook.

Below is the information that the Registrar shared with departmental HCS liaison regarding tuition waivers and the requirements for graduate students to enroll by November 20th.

"Tuition calculation for the spring 2021 semester is currently scheduled for December 4th, 2020. **Please ensure that your students who are on continuing appointments are enrolled in 6+ credit hours and waivers are submitted by November 20th, 2020**. Waiver requests for students in less than 6 hours will be rejected. Enrollment for graduate students begins on November 2nd, allowing almost 3 weeks for them to be enrolled and the waivers to be submitted prior to the deadline. Please communicate the importance of enrolling to your students, as the waiver requests cannot be submitted until they have satisfied this requirement. By working proactively, we can ensure that correct tuition and fees are assessed to students prior to semester start. " Please review the <u>Graduate Handbook Chapter 1: G3</u> for enrollment requirement and information about last semester enrollment policy and procedures.

NIJ's Research Assistantship Program (RAP) offers highly qualified doctoral students practical and applied research experience in the criminal justice field. They provide funds to participating universities to pay salaries and other costs associated with research assistants who work on NIJ research activities. The deadline for applications is **December 23, 2020.**

Seeking GRA to support rural and healthy food access programs at Kansas State University

K-State Research and Extension is seeking a graduate research assistant (GRA) to work with the Kansas Healthy Food Initiative and Rural Grocery Initiative. This GRA position is an opportunity for a M.A., M.S., or Ph.D. student to bring creative energy and vision to a comprehensive urban and rural food systems program. The ideal candidate will have broad experience in or hold an undergraduate (and possibly Master's degree) in fields related to food access, food systems, and/or community development. Candidates must have a commitment to issues of social justice and community engagement. This is a position that will work with an interdisciplinary team, employing a variety of applied and community-based research methods. Compensation is in the form of a \$25,000 stipend that can be applied to tuition.

This position will be available from January 2021 through December 2021 with future funding (secured through July 2023) contingent on satisfactory performance evaluations. Position begins as early as January 25, 2021.

IBUILD Graduate Research Fellowship

The Innovation in Buildings (IBUILD) Graduate Research Fellowship is now accepting applications. Selected fellows will advance their graduate research by receiving research and educational support to conduct innovative research at their home institution in an area with demonstrated relevance to building energy efficiency. Fellows will also gain professional development, mentoring, networking, and support for internship opportunities. Fellows receive a stipend of \$35,000, an allowance to offset the costs of health insurance up to \$16,000, research travel and materials up to \$12,000, and limited tuition allowance up to \$25,000. Fellowship will be awarded in 12-month increments based on an annual review of research progress and sustained alignment with designated BTO research areas. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen or Lawful Permanent Resident and be enrolled or intend to enroll as a full-time doctoral or master's graduate student at a qualified program requiring a research thesis/dissertation at an accredited U.S. college or university by September 1, 2021 with a cumulative graduate GPA of 3.00 or higher on a 4.00 scale. Application **Deadline: December 1, 2020, 5:00 PM EST.**

Graduate Fellowship Opportunity at Kansas State University

The Rural Resources Resiliency NSF Research Traineeship Program is now recruiting current K-State graduate students in Agricultural Economics, Biological and Agricultural Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Sociology, and closely related fields. The program prepares future leaders to solve the grand challenges of creating sustainable food, energy, and water systems in rural communities in semi-arid regions. We investigate engineering and socioeconomic innovations to conserve water, create renewable energy and help sustain rural communities. NSF sponsored training includes a generous stipend and paid tuition for up to two years for eligible trainees. Application deadline is **Jan. 8, 2021**.

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
