

Call for Travel & Research Grant Applications February 2009

The Institute for Military History & 20th Century Studies invites applications for research and travel grants. The Institute hopes to support research related to the Institute's mission of supporting scholarship and professional development of KSU faculty and graduate students.

Proposals should cover scholarship on any topic in military history or 20th century studies. For example, scholarship on a late 19th century topic such as American imperialism may be deemed directly supportive of a study of the United States' administration of the Philippines.

Grants may be used to underwrite research costs and travel for research, plus some limited amounts of other, related research costs, such as photocopying. Grants may be used to purchase special equipment, such as video or audio recorders, cameras, or computer hardware or software; however, any equipment purchased through Institute grant money is the property of the Institute and must revert to the physical possession of the Institute at the completion of the project for which it was purchased.

Grants may not be used to fund travel to conferences or to defray publication costs.

Applicants may request funding up to \$1000. Funding received should be expended between 1 May 2009 and 1 September 2010.

Faculty and graduate students are welcome to apply. Recipients of grants in 2008 are not eligible for grants in 2009.

Applications must include a completed application form (available from the Institute offices in 221 Eisenhower Hall or online at <http://www.k-state.edu/history/institute/> [click on "Announcements"]) and attached materials, as directed on the application form. Submit the completed application to the Institute offices by 5 p.m., Monday, **March 9th**.
