Preferred wetlands are >5ha with abundant aquatic-bed vegetation and open water, interspersed with robust emergent vegetation. Tend to avoid seasonal, semi-permanent wetlands. Like moderately deep waters (0.25-2m).

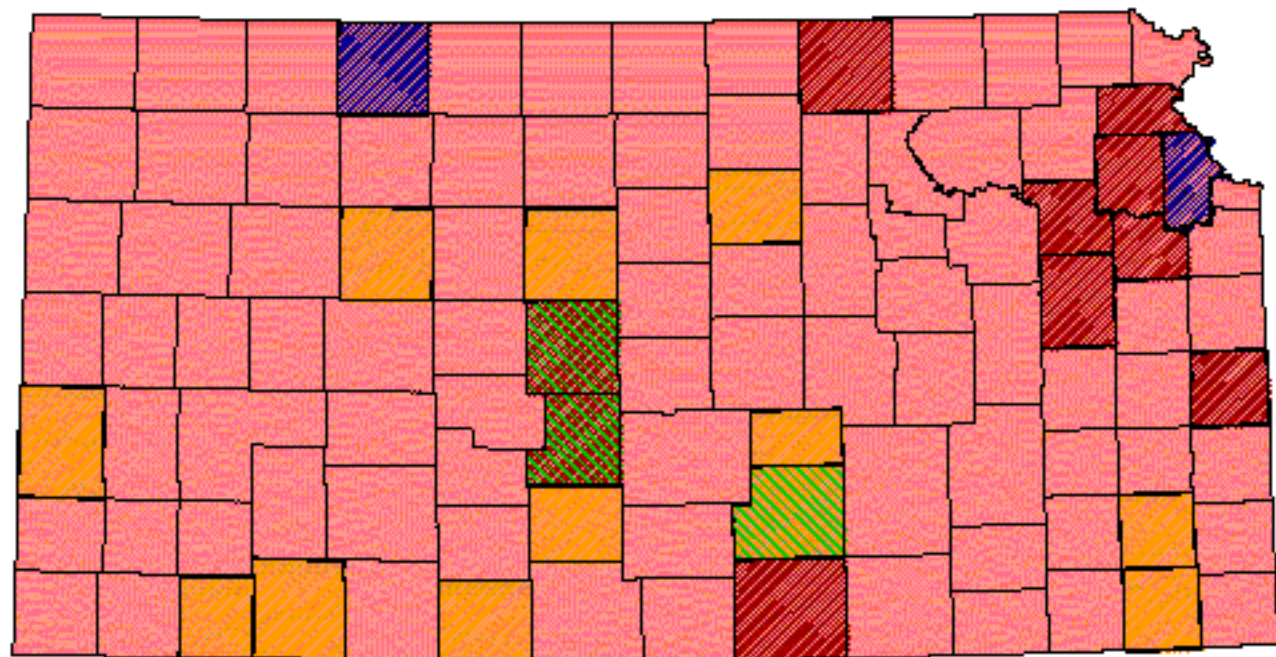
