recorded in 47 habitat codes and subcodes. Rural farmsteads and shelterbelts received the largest shelterbelts in mixed-grass prairie, and farmyards found in >85% of the windbreaks
nest site characteristics did not differ from those of Blue Jay and Mourning Dove.

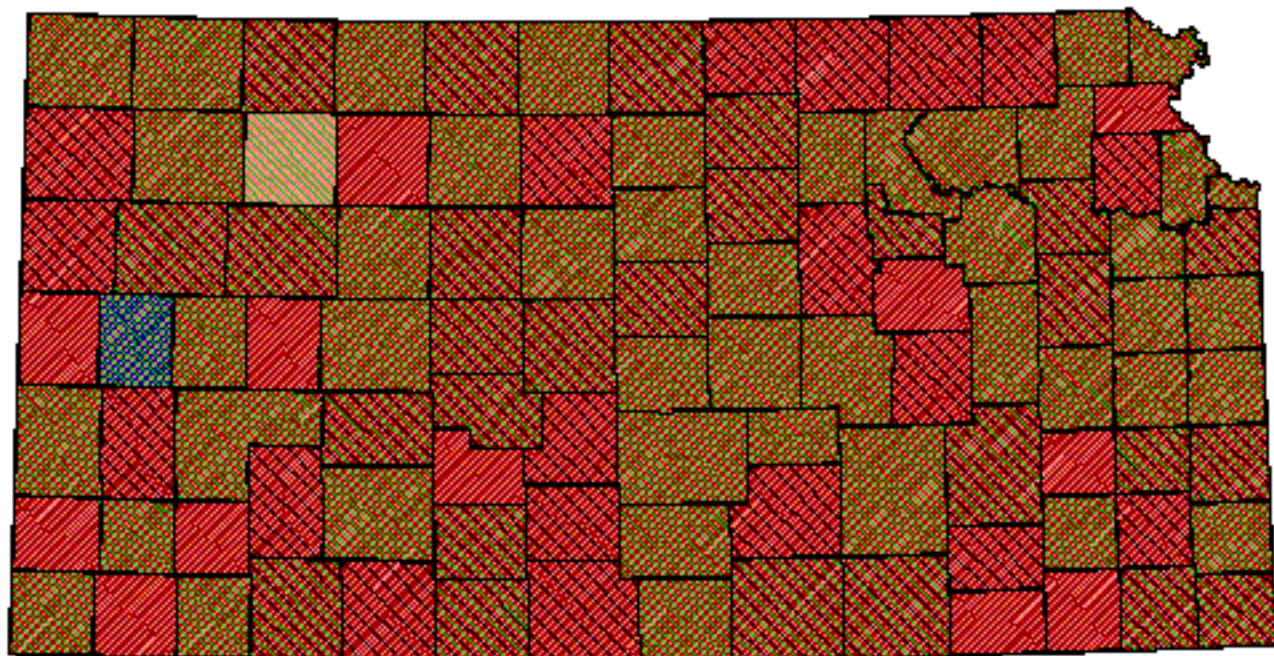

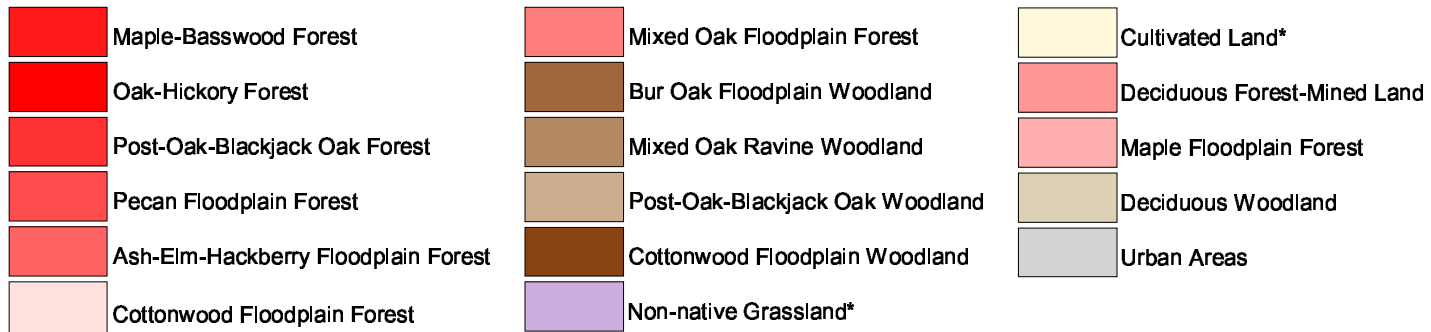
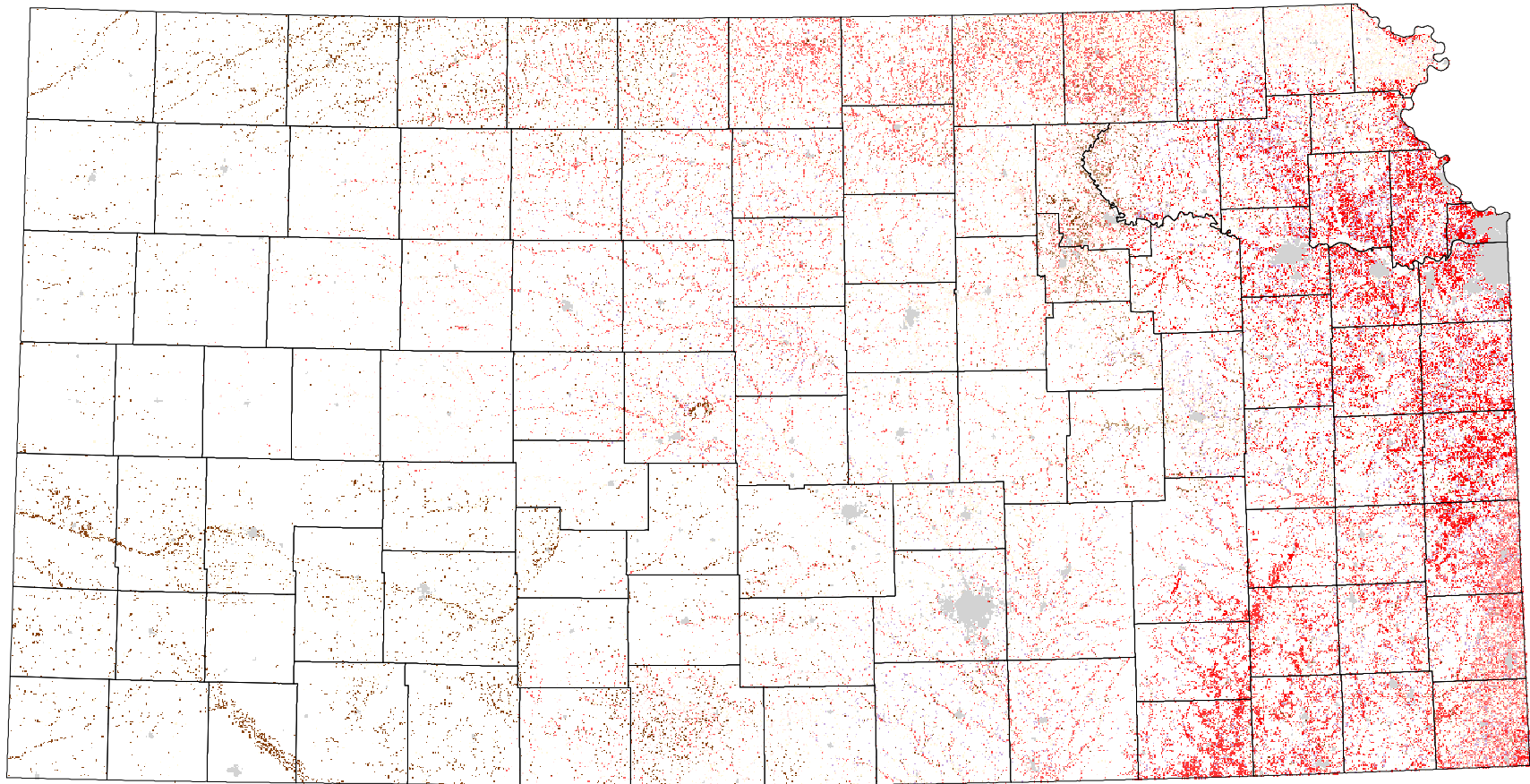
