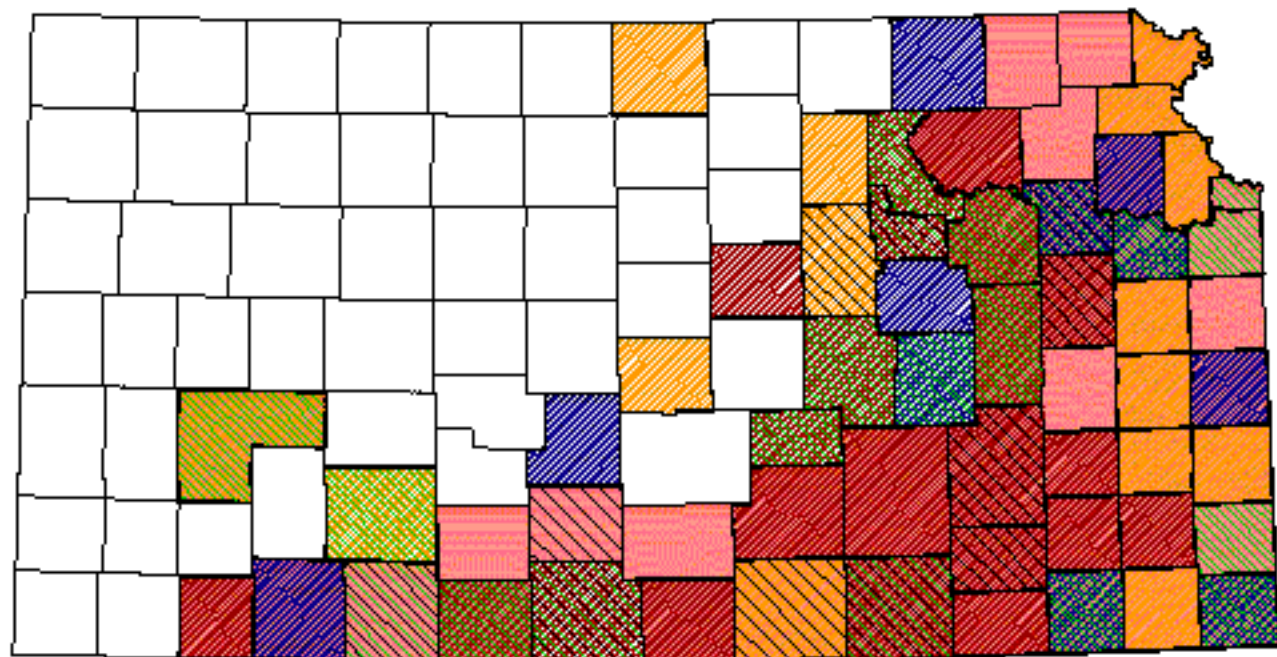
Comments
Prairie/shrub habitat - too small to map.
Brushy areas, scrub and thickets in open country, open and riparian woodland, and chaparral. Breeding territories usually contain mixtures of thick scrubby vegetation and open woodland, and nests are well concealed.
Record of nest in Finney County.
