suggested minimum area = 6 ha

smallest forests detected = 22 ha - 34 ha; mostly in forests >130

Comments

Densities of territorial males were approx. 1.5 times higher in larger tracts (> 500 ha) than in smaller fragments

Ordination study: found in well-developed shaded forests.

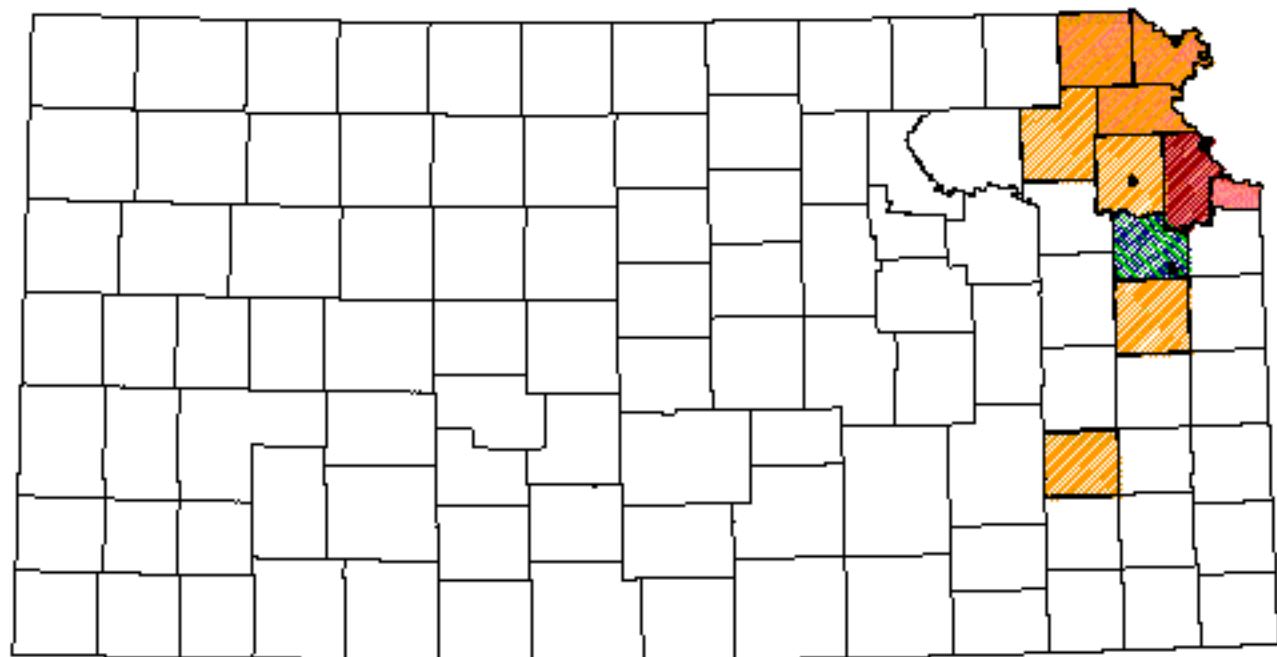
