## UHP Progress and Performance Policy

Membership in the UHP is a privilege. In addition to maintaining good standing vis-à-vis all Kansas State University academic and student policies, UHP program membership requires:

- 1. A minimum 3.50 cumulative GPA.
- 2. Progress toward the completion of UHP requirements.

These twin criteria will be administered as follows:

- First-year UHP members who do not complete *UHP 189: Honors Freshman Seminar*, automatically forfeit membership in the program unless explicitly granted a waiver.
- UHP students whose cumulative GPA falls below 3.50 automatically forfeit the UHP course priority registration privilege.
- Probation: Students may retain their UHP membership on a probationary status at the Director's discretion, with the proviso that probation does not reinstate the priority course registration privilege so long as the student falls below the 3.50 minimum GPA.
- Progress: Students are considered to have made minimum satisfactory progress if, at the conclusion of each year in the program, they meet the following cumulative benchmarks:
  - o 1<sup>st</sup> Year: UHP 189, 1 honors course, min. 3.50 GPA
  - o 2<sup>nd</sup> Year: UHP 189, 2 honors courses, 1 co-curricular experience, min. 3.50 GPA
  - o 3<sup>rd</sup> Year: UHP 189, 3 honors courses, 2 co-curricular experiences, min. 3.50 GPA
  - o 4<sup>th</sup> Year: UHP 189, 4 honors courses, 3 co-curricular experiences, min. 3.50 GPA
- Communication: Students will receive notification via e-mail of any concern regarding their GPA and/or their progress towards completion. Students will be invited to discuss issues with a UHP and/or College representative before any action is taken. Our philosophy is one of support and encouragement. We want to engage students with offers of help and assistance.
- Exceptions: Student progress and performance varies, often for idiosyncratic reasons. It is the stated goal of the UHP to provide members with every reasonable opportunity to complete UHP requirements and rectify performance challenges. When completion is, however, no longer reasonably likely, the Director shall discontinue membership.
- Appeal: students may appeal Director's decisions to the College Coordinator Committee.
