Patient's Rights and Responsibilities

Lafene Health Center presents the following with the expectation that observance of these Rights and Responsibilities will contribute to more effective patient care.

- ◆ The patient has the right to be granted impartial access to treatment that is available or medically indicated.
- ◆ The patient has the right to considerate, respectful care at all times with the recognition of personal dignity.
- ◆ The patient has the right to personal and informational privacy.
- ◆ The patient has the responsibility to provide accurate and complete information about personal health matters.
- ◆ The patient is responsible for following the treatment plan recommended by the physician and is responsible for his/her actions if treatment is refused or instructions are not followed.
- ◆ The patient is responsible for assuring the financial obligations of health care received.

For Your Good Health

Lafene Health Center is your professional resource for health care while at Kansas State University.

The Health Center is a professionally accredited health facility designed to provide cost effective, physician-directed health care and wellness information to students at K-State.

K-State students are charged a health fee which is included in their tuition each semester. This fee entitles access to all services provided at the Health Center. Eligibility for services is in effect approximately one week prior to the start of classes until midnight prior to the start of classes the following semester.

Lafene Health Center is fully accredited by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care.

The student health fee allows the student to see a health care provider at no charge for a consultation only or a short non-complex visit. Students who need a lengthy visit, complete physical exam, well woman exam, or other services or procedures such as laboratory tests, x-rays, physical therapy treatments, nutrition counseling, medications or medical supplies will be assessed a charge customarily much less than community rates.

◆ Allergy and Immunization Clinic	allergy and immunization injections
◆ Asthma Clinic	comprehensive medical care for asthma patients; join GetAir listserv by emailing healthy@ksu.edu with your name and eID
◆ Business Office	account, payment, and health insurance information
◆ General Medical Clinic	routine and urgent health care
◆ Health Information Management	maintains confidential patient medical records
◆ Health Promotion	health promotion and illness prevention information and consultation, including smoking cessation; join HealthyKSU listserv by emailing healthy@ksu.edu with your name and eID
◆ Laboratory	specimen collection and laboratory testing
◆ Nutrition Counseling	weight control, nutrition, eating disorders, medical nutrition therapy for special diets and fitness
◆ Pharmacy	drug information, fills prescriptions, and offers non-prescription products such as Advil, cough drops, etc. for purchase
◆ Physical Therapy	treats a multitude of sprains, strains, and injuries common to college students
◆ Radiology	x-ray services with film interpretation by radiologist
◆ Sports Medicine Clinic	evaluation and treatment of sports related injuries and medical conditions
◆ Travel Clinic	information and immunizations for travel - international and stateside
◆ Women's Clinic	well woman exam, information regarding HPV vaccination, contraceptive choices, and sexually transmitted disease testing
