To facilitate cultural exchange with the United Kingdom so that students can explore its culture, heritage, and history.
There are nine different sites in the United Kingdom, each with a distinct thematic focus. Applicants must choose one and direct their application to that site.
Number varies by site (ranges from 3 to 10). Fully funded: airfare both ways, applicable tuition and fees, room and board, and in some instances, a small daily allowance.
Three to six weeks, depending on the specific site.
U.S. citizen with passport. At least 18 years old before departure date. 3.7 GPA. Preference given to individuals who have not traveled out of country.
Undergraduates with two or more years left of study at the time of application (typically freshmen and sophomores).
From the website: We are interested in evidence of leadership qualities and initiative, academic ability, character, adaptability and ambassadorial quality, as well as an interest in the UK and its culture.

Depends on program choice. Typically late February or early March.
Completed online application form, including a prompt-based essay, a personal statement and several short answer questions, two reference letters, and official transcript.
