Kevin L. Stilley Service to Leadership Award

Biography

The Kevin L. Stilley Service to Leadership Award recognizes the contributions of a LGBTQ+ or allied undergraduate or graduate student for providing service to the LGBTQ+ community in the Flint Hills Region. The award is for the 2024-2025 academic year. The ideal candidate shall be recognized as a leader within the minoritized sexuality and gender identity community and as a leader who promotes diversity, equity, and social justice for all people. In all other respects, this award shall be given without restriction to race, sex, gender identity, national origin, religion, age, sexuality, or disability.

Eligibility

Per the provider the applicant of the award must meet the following criteria. If applicant does not meet all the criteria, they may address and appeal in their essay to be submitted.

- 1. The recipient(s) of this award will be a student properly enrolled in any curriculum at Kansas State University.
- 2. The recipient(s) must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5, based on a 4.0 scale.
- 3. The recipient(s) must be a permanent resident of the United States.

The applicant must submit the following materials to be considered for the award.

- 1. Applicants Information Page
- 2. Essay Submission
- 3. Signed Release of Information Form

Selection Timeline
