PROGRAM

K-State in Leipzig is a five-week linguistic and cultural immersion course: intensive language instruction at the Herder Institute (Universität Leipzig) combined with a two-week, faculty-led tour of Saxony and Berlin, during which students will visit, experience, talk and write about important German cultural and historical sites. Upon return to K-State (Fall 2009), students will share their experiences through presentations and discussions in lower-level German language classes.

FACULTY LEADER

Dr. Betz is a native speaker of German. She was born in Romania and grew up in Northern Bavaria. She completed her Ph.D. in German Linguistics with an additional Certificate of Advanced Study in Second Language Acquisition and Teacher Education at the University of Illinois. In the Department of Modern Languages, Professor Betz teaches German language at all levels, including German for professional purposes, German Studies courses, and Linguistics/Applied Linguistics classes. She also coordinates the basic language program.

DATES

Begins June 14, 2009

Ends July 16, 2009

CREDIT

4 hours of undergraduate transfer credit will be awarded for successful completion of the German language course. 3 undergraduate KSU credit hours will be awarded for successful completion of GRMN 529 (Special Studies in German).

ELIGIBILITY

Students should have a minimum GPA of 2.5. Previous study of German is recommended, but it is not a prerequisite for participation in the program. Students will be placed in language courses based on previous language experience.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Visit Dresden and Meissen: Baroque city, theaters, royal porcelain manufacturing
- Bicycle tour of Leipzig countryside
- Tour Ore Mountains and Chemnitz (fairy tale country)
- Visit Wittenberg, city of Luther's 95 Theses
- Tour Weimar, city of German classicism
- Visit East Berlin: Alexanderplatz, Friedrichshain, and Treptower Park
- Attend opera in Berlin
- Visit German National History Museums, Pergamon Museum, various art museums
- Visit Jewish Berlin: Jewish Museum, Holocaust Memorial, Topographie of Terror, and Oranienburger Tor

COST

Program Fees: \$3,073 (includes accommodations, in-country transportation, admission to cultural sites, group meals, tuition/fees at Herder Institute in Germany, study abroad fee, and international medical insurance)

Tuition and Fees: Tuition and fees for one 3-credit hour K-State undergraduate course. Division of Continuing Education Fee: \$21.50.

Anticipated Additional Expenses: Individual meals, international airfare, books and personal expenses.
