Minutes

- 1. Dr. Cates called the meeting to order at 1:00 pm.
- 2. The minutes from the April 8, 2010 meeting were approved.
- 3. Dr. Cates presented an update of MPH students, graduates and the current status of Fall 2010 admissions. See attachment.
- 4. Dr. Cates announced that the BS/MPH proposal has been approved by the Graduate Council and by the Faculty Senate for a Fall 2010 start. The group discussed next steps and possibilities for students. It is now up to the individual departments to decide specific requirements for the joint degree; there will be no change to MPH requirements. The committee recommended to ensure that undergraduate advisors are aware of this new possibility.
- 5. The committee approved the MPH Graduate Faculty applications for the following individuals:
 - a. Dr. Weiqun (George) Wang, Associate Professor in Human Nutrition
 - b. Dr. Joy Gordon, Associate Professor in the School of Journalism and Mass Communication
 - c. Dr. Brandon Harris, Assistant Professor in Special Education, Counseling and Student Affairs
- 6. Dr. Cates updated the entire group on his meetings with the Provost (March 30th) and with the Deans and Department Heads (May 3rd). He provided a copy of the slides from his presentation to the Deans and a slide of a five year history of total enrollment in MPH Core Courses (see attached). The growth in MPH student enrollment has put pressure on some of the core classes, and the Provost has encouraged us to provide more class sections. She promised to provide a "safety net" of limited funds to help make that happen; department heads are responsible to identify their needs. The group also discussed various ways to assist in providing advisors to students. Dr. Cates agreed to contact all current faculty members to determine their continued willingness and desire to serve in various capacities as MPH faculty members, to include advising.
- 7. The group agreed to provide emphasis area-specific competencies and associated course requirements to Dr. Cates by August 1st, 2010.

Dr. Cates will contact the club officers.
- 10. Dr. Procter announced that the College of Human Ecology has hired a new faculty member, Dr. Samara Joy Nielsen, and she will start in July 2010.
- 11. There will be no meetings in June and July. The MPH Program office will be in touch with all continuing Committee members to determine the times for meetings in August and the fall semester months.
