Organ/Keyboard/Collaborative Artist

Duties

Primary responsibilities are to teach applied organ and piano and to serve as a collaborative artist in solo and chamber settings. This faculty member must be active as a performer, both on- and off-campus, and is expected to recruit and maintain a successful studio in the organ/keyboards areas of performance.

A strong background and teaching skills in theory and/or history is highly desirable. Additional duties may be assigned based on the candidate's strengths as they align with the department's curricular/service needs.

Qualifications

An earned doctorate or commensurate professional experience is required. Other requirements are demonstrated success in collegiate-level studio and classroom instruction. Ability and willingness to work with diverse student populations required.

The University
