The Bison Loop Tour is a driving tour of a restricted access area. Bison were introduced to the Konza Prairie in 1987 and now number about 300.

The Konza Environmental Education Program (KEEP) offers guided tours of the Konza Prairie Biological Station, giving you the opportunity to see parts of this prairie not usually open to the public. KEEP docents, trained volunteers with a wealth of information about the tallgrass prairie ecosystem, serve as guides. One or more will join us for the Bison Loop driving tour.
