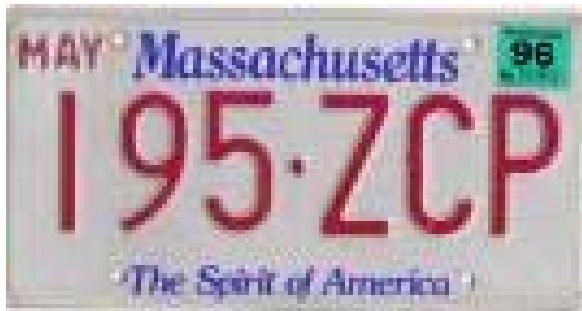


# Leaving Massachusetts ts

Sarah tutors people on her floor in Spanish, Statistics, and College Algebra.

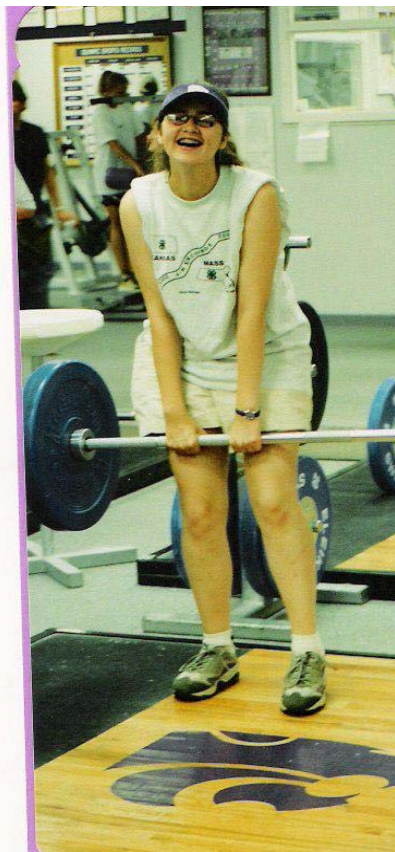

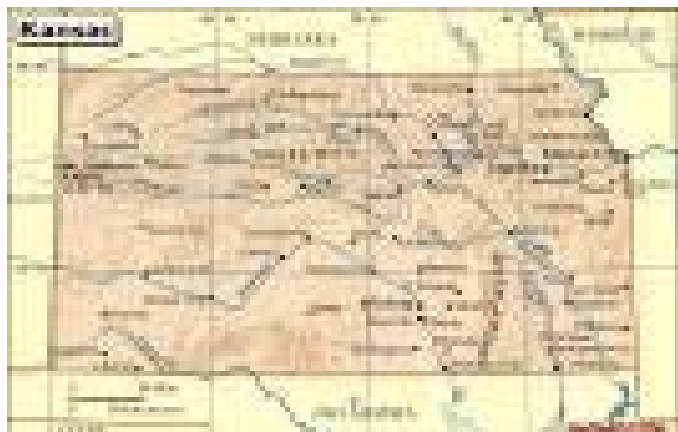
Sarah applied for a Disney Internship and got her first choice job in retail at the Magic Kingdom. She turned down the opportunity in order to remain at K-State.

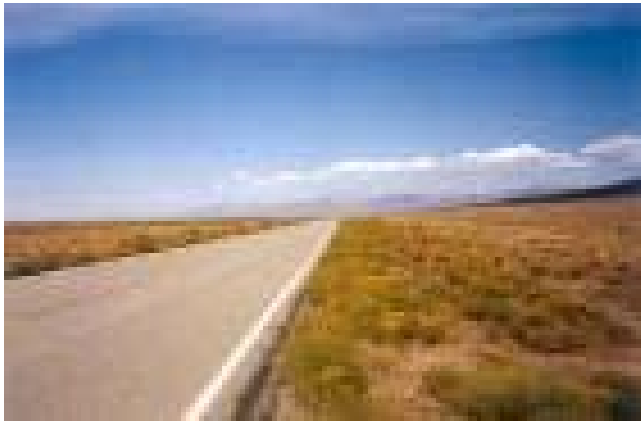


## In Kansas

# Open Road Ahead

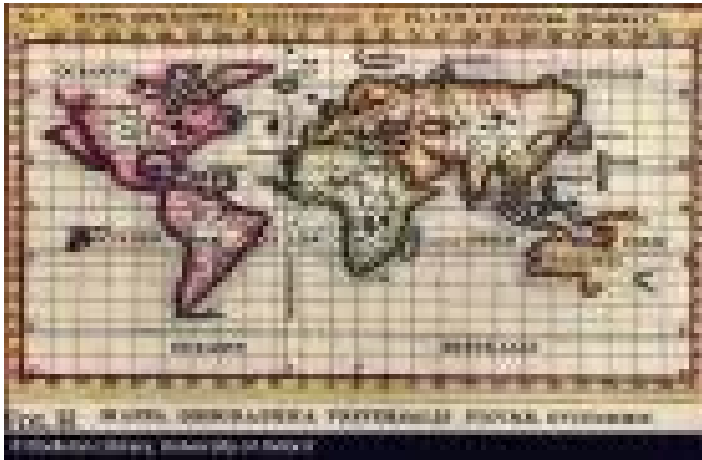
Next Year in Moore-
