17 **WHEREAS,** Gary Hellebust, KSU Foundation President and CEO, has announced his intent to step down from  
18 his position effective at the end of the calendar year;

19  
20 **WHEREAS,** Hellebust has worked for the KSU Foundation for 23 years and served as President and CEO of  
21 the Foundation for 13 years;

22  
23 **WHEREAS,** During Hellebust’s tenure as President and CEO, annual contributions to the KSU Foundation  
24 increased by more than \$75 million to reach a record high of \$99.5 million in 2008. Under his  
25 leadership a total of \$885 million was raised;

26  
27 **WHEREAS,** Two major fundraising campaigns took place while Hellebust was President and CEO. Both  
28 campaigns exceeded their fundraising goals, with the Scholarship Campaign raising \$63.5 million,  
29 and the Changing Lives Campaign, which concluded in 2008, raising \$529.5 million;

30  
31 **WHEREAS,** Hellebust is a 1969 graduate of K-State with a Bachelor’s degree in Animal Sciences and Industry,  
32 and he and his wife Lois are members of the KSU Foundation’s Presidents Club, the Land Grant  
33 Legacy Society and the K-State Alumni Association;

34  
35 **WHEREAS,** Hellebust will continue to work for the KSU Foundation under a phased retirement program  
36 beginning in January 2010. He will work off-site on mutually-agreed upon initiatives for the  
37 Foundation and the University; and

38  
39 **WHEREAS,** In his time at the KSU Foundation, Hellebust has consistently been representative of the idea of K-  
40 State as a “student-centered university” and has worked to ensure funding for student scholarships  
41 and programs, and he deserves to be commended for his dedication to students and the community  
42 of Kansas State University.

7 and athletic events; and

9 **WHEREAS,** Students have supported the construction and maintenance of the coliseum; and

11 **WHEREAS,** The Bramlage Repair and Replacement fee has provided needed support for Bramlage  
12 Coliseum.

16 **SECTION 1.** KSU SGA Statutes Chapter 32 is hereby amended to read:

17  
18 **BRAMLAGE COLISEUM BUDGET AGREEMENT**

19  
20 This agreement made this \_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2009, between the Kansas State University Student  
21 Governing Association (SENATE), and Kansas State University Bramlage Coliseum (DEPARTMENT).

22  
23 1. The annual DEPARTMENT privilege fee budget of \$15,000.00 (BUDGET) shall be funded for the  
24 following fiscal years: July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011; and July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012; and  
25 July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. The BUDGET will be reviewed prior to year 2012-2013.

26  
27 2. Any reserve account amount over \$100,000 shall revert back to the Campus Privilege Fee Emergency  
28 and Debt Reduction Account.

29  
30 3. This agreement supersedes any previous agreement made by Kansas State University Student Senate  
31 and/or Kansas State University Student Governing Association with Bramlage Coliseum regarding funding  
32 of budgets and use of such funding.

33  
34 4. Any breach of this agreement by the DEPARTMENT will result in automatic review by Kansas State  
35 University Student Senate and such review could result in decrease or termination of funding of the  
36 BUDGET. The failure of SENATE to exercise any of its rights in any instance shall not constitute a waiver  
37 of such rights in that instance or in any other instance.

38  
39 5. Within 60 days after the end of each fiscal year, the Director of the DEPARTMENT shall submit a  
40 written summary of the Budget Expenditures to the Privilege Fee Chair for review by SENATE.

41  
42 6. No construction of or renovation of a building or facility at KSU is permitted with privilege fees unless  
43 the fee was established by a binding referendum vote of the student body. (SGA Constitution Article V  
44 Section 509 Letter C and Article XI Section 1105)

45  
46 7. This agreement shall be governed by and subject to the laws of the State of Kansas.

47  
48 8. By signing this agreement, the representatives of the respective parties hereby represent that each is duly  
49 authorized by his or her party to execute this document on behalf of such party and that the party agrees to  
50 be bound by the provisions of the agreement.

51  
52 9. Bill 09/10/06 becomes effective upon execution of this agreement by: the Privilege Fee Chair; the  
53 Director of Bramlage Coliseum; the Speaker of the Student Seante; the Vice President for Student Life; and  
54 the Student Body President.
