8 Elections and Elections Review Committee; and

10 WHEREAS, After evaluation of the current SGA Elections and Elections Committee, it has become
11 apparent that refinements are in order.

12
13 BE IT ENACTED THAT:

14
15 SECTION 1. Article I of the Kansas State University Student Governing Association By-Laws is
16 amended to read as follows:

17 Section. 1. SGA Elections.

18 A. Elections Commissioner.

19 1. *The Elections Commissioner shall be appointed by the third Thursday of*
20 *October, by the Speaker of the Student Senate, the Student Body President and*
21 *the Attorney General, with the approval by Student Senate. For cause, the*
22 *Elections Commissioner may be removed from office by a unanimous vote of the*
23 *Speaker of the Student Senate, the Student Body President and the Attorney*
24 *General, or a 2/3 majority vote of the total membership of Student Senate,*
25 *selected and qualified. Elections Commissioner shall be responsible for*
26 *carrying out the Kansas State University Student Governing Association*
27 *elections, carrying out all provisions of the Elections Regulations Code, and*
28 *reviewing and making recommendations to Student Senate concerning revisions*
29 *of the Elections Regulations Code.*

30 2. *The Elections Commissioner shall be responsible for carrying out the Kansas*
31 *State University Student Governing Association elections, carrying out all*
32 *provisions of the Elections Regulations Code, and reviewing and making*
33 *recommendations to Senate Operations Standing Committee of Student Senate*
34 *concerning revisions of the Elections Regulations Code. The Elections*
35 *Commissioner shall be appointed by the Speaker of the Student Senate, the*
36 *Student Body President and the Attorney General with the approval by Student*
37 *Senate.*

38 3. *In the event of the resignation, removal from office or the permanent inability of*
39 *the Elections Commissioner to discharge his or her duties as the Elections*
40 *Commissioner, the Speaker of the Student Senate, the Student Body President,*
41 *and the Attorney General shall appoint a new Elections Commissioner within 48*
42 *hours of notice, with the approval of Student Senate.*

43 B. ~~Student Tribunal. Deputy Commissioner~~

44 1. *The Student Tribunal shall be responsible for carrying out all provisions of the*
45 *Elections Regulations Code during the appeal process. No member on the*
46 *Student Tribunal shall be a candidate for any office by which the Elections*
47 *Commissioner has authority. The Deputy Commissioner shall be appointed by*
48 *the Commissioner with the approval of Student Senate.*

49 2. ~~Duties of the Deputy Commissioner shall include tasks delegated by the~~
50 ~~Commissioner, excluding any election code violation rulings.~~

51 C. ~~The Elections Review Committee~~

52 1. ~~The Elections Review Committee shall be composed of five members not~~
53 ~~including the chair. There will be two members from the Judicial Branch who~~
54 ~~will be appointed by the Attorney General with the approval of Student Senate,~~
55 ~~and three members from the Legislative Branch appointed by the Senate~~

~~2. No member on the Elections Review Committee shall actively or passively campaign for another student's SGA elections campaign.~~

~~3. No member on the Elections Review Committee shall financially contribute to another student's SGA election campaign.~~

CD. Election Procedures.

1. The Elections Regulations Code shall govern all Student Governing Association elections at Kansas State University.

DE. ~~The Elections Commissioner and members~~ Members of Student Tribunal ~~and members of Judicial Council~~ shall not actively or passively campaign for another student's SGA campaign.

EF. ~~The Elections Commissioner and members~~ Members of Student Tribunal, ~~and members of Judicial Council~~ shall not financially contribute to another student's SGA campaign.

SECTION 2. Article 4, Section 4 of the Kansas State University Student Governing Association By-Laws is amended to read as follows:

Section 4. Presidential Succession.

A. In the event of the temporary absence or inability of the Student Body President, the Student Body Vice President shall exercise the powers and duties of the Student Body President.

B. In the event of the resignation, removal from office or the permanent inability of the Student Body President to discharge his or her duties as the Student Body President, the Student Body Vice President shall succeed to the office of Student Body President.

C. In the event of the resignation or removal of the Student Body President and Student Body Vice President, the Speaker of the Student Senate shall serve as Interim Student Body President.

1. In the event of the Speaker of the Student Senate serving as Interim Student Body President, the Student Senate shall appoint an ~~Emergency Election Committee~~ Elections Commissioner as outlined in the Elections Regulations Code; unless there are less than 45 class days before the next election in which case the Speaker of the Student Senate will serve as the Student Body President for the remainder of the term.

D. In the event of the resignation or removal of the Student Body Vice President, the Student Body President will appoint a new Student Body Vice President subject to approval by Student Senate.

SECTION 3. Article 6, Section 5 of the Kansas State University Student Governing Association By-Laws is amended to read as follows:

Section 5. Duties of Attorney General and Judicial Boards.

C. Duties of Student Tribunal.

1. Interpret the KSU SGA Constitution, By-Laws and legislation, upon written request by the Student Body President, Chair of Student Senate or by presentation of a petition signed by 50 members of the KSU SGA. The interpretation should be (in the order of priority):

a. Based primarily on the common understanding of the words and phrases.

b. Logically consistent with the remainder of the document.

c. Consistent with prior interpretations.

d. In the best interest of the members of the KSU SGA.

2. Try bills of impeachment passed by Student Senate, with the exception of

judicial boards.

3. Hear appeals of decisions from the Housing and Dining Services Judicial Boards, Ad Hoc Boards, ~~SGA Elections Review Committee~~, SGA Elections Commissioner, and Student Review Board, with the authority to modify or overturn the decisions of such persons or bodies.
4. Hear in the first instance disciplinary cases involving special circumstances or situations for which jurisdiction is not otherwise described. These cases shall be assigned by the Attorney General or designee upon consultation with the Dean of Student Life or designee.
5. Consider appeals of decisions originating under the Policy Prohibiting Sexual Harassment, Policy Prohibiting Sexual Violence, and Policy Prohibiting Racial and/or Ethnic Harassment when appeal beyond the administrative process is desired.
6. Hear appeals from any committee created according to the legislative powers granted in Article V of the KSU SGA Constitution when legislation specifies such an appeal.
7. Consider appeals of parking privilege revocations issued by KSU Parking Services.

SECTION 4. Upon passage by the Student Senate and signature of the Student Body President, this bill shall take effect on November 1, 2009 and upon passage of Bill 09/10/13.

7 **WHEREAS,** Chapter 26 in the Statutes for the Kansas State University Student Governing Association
8 outlines the guidelines for the Student-Centered Tuition Enhancement (SCTE)
9 Committee; and

10
11 **WHEREAS,** It is necessary to update the membership of the SCTE committee.

12
13 **BE IT ENACTED THAT:**

14
15 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 26 of the KSU SGA Statutes be amended to read as follows.

16
17 26-0101 The Student-Centered Tuition Enhancements (SCTE) Committee shall consist of the following
18 members:

- 19 A. The Student Body Vice President, who shall serve as the Chair and who shall vote only in
20 the case of a tie.
- 21 ~~B. The University Relations Standing Committee Chair, who shall serve as the Vice Chair.~~
- 22 ~~C.B.~~ Six Student Senators, representing different colleges and different standing committees,
23 appointed by the *Speaker of the* Student Senate ~~Chair~~ upon approval by Student Senate.
- 24 ~~D.C.~~ Four at-large members, representing different campus constituencies, appointed by the
25 Student Body President upon approval by Student Senate.
- 26 ~~E.D.~~ The ~~chief academic officer of the~~ Student Body President's ~~Cabinet~~ *Chief of Staff*.
- 27 ~~F.E.~~ One Faculty Senate Representative to Student Senate, who shall be a non-voting member.
- 28 ~~G.F.~~ The Coordinator of the Office of Student Activities and Services, who shall be a non-
29 voting member.

30
31 **SECTION 2.** Upon passage by the Student Senate and signature of the Student Body President, this bill
32 shall take effect immediately.

7 **WHEREAS,** The Campus Activities Board is a committee that oversees all registered student
8 organizations under the Office of Student Activities and Services;

9
10 **WHEREAS,** The description and makeup of the Campus Activities Board need revision for the 2009-
11 2010 term;

12
13 **WHEREAS,** The Fine Arts Council no longer exists;

14
15 **WHEREAS,** There is a lack of representation from registered student organizations; and

16
17 **WHEREAS,** The Campus Advisory Board should only meet when problems or complaints arise.

18
19 **BE IT ENACTED THAT:**

20
21 **SECTION 1.** Article V, Section 11 of the Kansas State University Student Governing Association By-
22 Laws be amended to read as follows:

23 Section. 11. The Campus Activities Board, acting as a committee of Student Senate shall:

- 24 A. Be comprised of the Speaker pro tempore of the Student Senate, acting as the chair of the
25 committee and voting only in the case of a tie, the Student Body Vice President, the SGA
26 Treasurer, the Chair of the Senate Operations Standing Committee, ~~the Fine Arts Council~~
27 ~~Chair~~ *a representative of a student organization selected by the Speaker pro tempore of*
28 *the Student Senate*, and a representative of multicultural student organizations selected by
29 the Multicultural Student Organization office. The Coordinator of the Office of Student
30 Activities and Services, or designee, who shall act as the Activities Director, shall be a
31 non-voting ex-officio member.
- 32 B. Oversee the activities of the Activities Director and the Office of Student Activities and
33 Services regarding the registration of student organizations.
- 34 C. Have the authority to reverse or amend the decisions of the Activities Director and the
35 Allocations Committee regarding the registration and classification of organizations.
- 36 D. Recommend changes regarding the registration of, funding of, or services provided to
37 registered organizations.
- 38 E. ~~Be required to meet once each Student Senate term.~~ The Campus Activities Board Chair,
39 upon request of the Speaker of the Student Senate or the Activities Director, may call a
40 ~~special meeting~~ *the board together* to review any problems or complaints brought forth.

41
42 **SECTION 2.** Upon passage by the Student Senate and signature of the Student Body President, this bill
43 shall take effect immediately.
