8 **WHEREAS,** Bethany Bohnenblust of Altamont, Kansas, is a junior in agricultural communications
9 and journalism at Kansas State University and was a national officer candidate at the
10 2009 National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana;

12 **WHEREAS,** Bethany Bohnenblust participated in an intense five-day selection process that included
13 five rounds of interviews, a written test and two writing exercises, after which she was
14 elected National Secretary;

16 **WHEREAS,** In her capacity as a national officer, Bethany Bohnenblust will represent more than
17 500,000 FFA Members while traveling more than 100,000 miles providing personal
18 growth and leadership training for students and meeting with leaders in business,
19 government, and education;

29 **SECTION 1.** The Kansas State University Student Governing Association commends and
30 congratulates Bethany Bohnenblust on her election as a National FFA officer.

7 **WHEREAS,** The Student Body President is in need of an advisory board that will represent the views
8 of various constituents across campus;

9
10 **WHEREAS,** There is a desire for increased representation for various groups of students within the
11 Executive Branch of SGA;

12
13 **WHEREAS,** The advice and suggestions of an advisory board would be beneficial to the successful
14 completion of the Student Body President’s duties; and

15
16 **WHEREAS,** The Student Body President has the opportunity to appoint other representatives to the
17 Student Body President’s Advisory Board throughout the term.

18
19 **BE IT ENACTED THAT:**

20
21 **SECTION 1.** Article IV of the Kansas State University Student Governing Association By-Laws is
22 hereby amended to read as follows:

23 Section. 1. Meetings of the KSU SGA shall be called at the discretion of the Student Body President.

24 Section. 2. Student Body Vice President. The Student Body Vice President shall assist the Student Body
25 President in all executive duties, attend meetings and functions at the request or in the place of the
26 Student Body President.

27 Section. 3. The Student Body President’s Cabinet shall consist of the following officers.

28 A. The Chief of Staff, whose duties shall include:

- 29 1. Coordinate the activities of Cabinet.
- 30 2. Serve as advisor to Cabinet members.
- 31 3. Conduct communication between Cabinet members and the Student Body
32 President and between Cabinet members and Student Senate.
- 33 4. Chair Cabinet Meetings.
- 34 5. Give directors’ reports for Cabinet members unable to attend Student Senate
35 meetings, as necessary.

36 B. The Public Relations Director, who shall foster public relations and enhance the
37 distribution of information for the Executive branch.

- 38 1. Attend Student Senate meetings.
- 39 2. Serve on the Public Relations Standing Committee.

40 C. The College of Technology and Aviation Student Body President (or designee) shall be
41 an ex officio member during the duration of the Student Body President’s term of office
42 and shall represent the interests and concerns of the College of Technology and Aviation
43 in Salina.

44 D. The International Affairs Director, who shall represent the interests and concerns of
45 international students.

- 46 1. Serve as the SGA Liaison to the Office of International Programs.
- 47 2. Attend International Coordinating Council Meetings.

- 48 E. The Multicultural Affairs Director, who shall represent the interests and concerns of
49 multicultural students.
- 50 1. Represent the Student Body President's Cabinet on the Diversity Programming
51 Committee.
- 52 2. Serve on the President's Commission on Multicultural Affairs.
- 53 3. Meet regularly with student leaders of multicultural organizations.
- 54 F. The State Relations Director, who shall represent the interests and concerns of the KSU
55 SGA to state governments.
- 56 1. Attend monthly Board of Regents Meetings with the Student Body President.
- 57 2. Assist in coordination of State Higher Education Day.
- 58 3. Assist in coordination of Big XII on the Hill Day.
- 59 4. Serve on Governmental Relations Standing Committee.
- 60 G. The Local Relations Director, who shall represent the interests and concerns of the KSU
61 SGA to local governments.
- 62 1. Provide updates to the Student Body President and Student Senate concerning
63 the City Commission.
- 64 2. Serve on Governmental Relations Standing Committee.
- 65 H. The Technology Coordinator, who shall promote improved technology resources and
66 represent students on matters of technology.
- 67 1. Serve on Faculty Senate Committee on Technology
- 68 2. Serve as SGA Liaison to the Vice Provost for Information Technology Services.
- 69 I. The Student Director of Sustainability, who shall represent the interests and concerns of
70 students regarding sustainability.
- 71 1. Serve on the Student Sustainability Coalition.
- 72 2. Serve as SGA Liaison to the K-State Director of Sustainability.
- 73 J. Such other appointed officers as determined by the Student Body President.

74 *Section. 4. The Student Body President's Advisory Board shall consist of the following members.*

- 75 A. *President of Graduate Student Council, or his/her designee.*
- 76 B. *President of Interfraternity Council, or his designee.*
- 77 C. *President of International Coordinating Council, or his/her designee.*
- 78 D. *Representative of Multicultural Student Organizations selected by the Multicultural
79 Student Organization Leadership Council.*
- 80 E. *Representative of non-traditional students selected by the Non-Traditional Student office.*
- 81 F. *President of Panhellenic Council, or her designee.*
- 82 G. *President of Association of Residence Halls, or his/her designee.*
- 83 H. *College of Technology and Aviation Student Body President, or his/her designee.*
- 84 I. *Representative of student athletes selected by the Department of Athletics.*
- 85 J. *Representative of the campus sustainability office, recommended by the Director of
86 Sustainability.*
- 87 K. *Such other appointed officers as determined by the Student Body President.*

88 *Section. 45. Presidential Succession.*

- 89 A. In the event of the temporary absence or inability of the Student Body President, the

90 Student Body Vice President shall exercise the powers and duties of the Student Body
91 President.

92 B. In the event of the resignation, removal from office or the permanent inability of the
93 Student Body President to discharge his or her duties as the Student Body President, the
94 Student Body Vice President shall succeed to the office of Student Body President.

95 C. In the event of the resignation or removal of the Student Body President and Student
96 Body Vice President, the Speaker of the Student Senate shall serve as Interim Student
97 Body President.

98 1. In the event of the Speaker of the Student Senate serving as Interim Student
99 Body President, the Student Senate shall appoint an Emergency Election
100 Committee as outlined in the Elections Regulations Code; unless there are less
101 than 45 class days before the next election in which case the Speaker of the
102 Student Senate will serve as the Student Body President for the remainder of the
103 term.

104 D. In the event of the resignation or removal of the Student Body Vice President, the Student
105 Body President will appoint a new Student Body Vice President subject to approval by
106 Student Senate.

108 **SECTION 2.** Upon passage of the Student Senate and signature of the Student Body President, this bill
109 shall take effect immediately.

8 **WHEREAS,** The City of Manhattan, Kansas, is in the process of considering an ordinance that would
9 make the use of hand-held communication devices while operating a motor vehicle illegal
10 within the city limits;

11
12 **WHEREAS,** Such a ban could have detrimental effects on students, businesses, and visitors;

13
14 **WHEREAS,** The safety of the citizens of Manhattan and the students of Kansas State University is of
15 utmost importance, and distraction during driving increases the likelihood of a motor
16 vehicle accident;

17
18 **WHEREAS,** Compatibility of city and campus laws is an important part of the relationship
19 between the City of Manhattan and Kansas State University; and

20
21 **WHEREAS,** A dialogue between the City and University is important and a resolution on Student
22 Senate's position accomplishes this goal.

23
24 **BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

25
26 **SECTION 1.** The Kansas State University Student Senate does not support a ban on hand-held
27 communication devices while operating a motor vehicle within the City of Manhattan.

28
29 **SECTION 2.** Student Senate recommends a ban on text messaging while operating a motor vehicle as a
30 secondary offense in lieu of a ban against all hand-held communication devices.

31
32 **SECTION 3.** Student Senate recommends that Kansas State University comply with any ordinance, so
33 as to maintain uniformity in enforcement within both the city and university.

35 **SECTION 4.** Upon passage, a copy of this resolution be sent to University President Kirk Schulz,
