**RESOLUTION CONCERNING  
THE K-STATE 8 GENERAL  
EDUCATION PROPOSAL**

2  
3  
4  
5 **BY:** SGA Executive Committee and Lydia Peele

6  
7 **WHEREAS,** Kansas State University should uphold a general education curriculum that “provides for a  
8 student’s exposure to a broad range of ideas, knowledge, and ways of thinking by  
9 requiring all degree-bound students to complete courses across a specified range of  
10 subjects and academic disciplines” (*K-State 8 General Education Proposal*);

11  
12 **WHEREAS,** On April 23, 2009, Karen Myers-Bowman represented the General Education Task Force  
13 in a presentation to Student Senate on the proposed K-State 8 General Education  
14 Program;

15  
16 **WHEREAS,** Following the presentation, members of the Student Governing Association spent more  
17 than an hour asking questions and addressing concerns they had with the K-State 8  
18 General Education Program;

19  
20 **WHEREAS,** The K-State 8 General Education Program outlines eight areas each student’s program of  
21 study must incorporate, including Aesthetic Experience and Interpretive Understanding,  
22 Empirical and Quantitative Reasoning, Ethical Reasoning and Responsibility, Global  
23 Issues and Perspectives, Historical Perspectives, Human Diversity within the United  
24 States, Natural and Physical Sciences, and Social Sciences. Students expressed numerous  
25 concerns surrounding the proposed general education program, including concerns with  
26 having Human Diversity within the United States as a separate theme, concerns with the  
27 title and description of the Aesthetic Experience and Interpretive Understanding theme,  
28 as well as concerns that some areas are vaguely broad, while others are more narrow;

29  
30 **WHEREAS,** The K-State 8 General Education Program states “the intent of the K-State 8 is for  
31 students to explore the perspectives of disciplines that may be quite different from those  
32 of their own majors” requiring a minimum of four different course prefixes to be  
33 represented in the fulfillment of the K-State 8 requirements. Students addressed concerns,  
34 especially from the professional schools of Engineering and Architecture, with being able  
35 to acquire the technical and design skills required in their profession without an  
36 additional number of courses, as well as concerns with missing out on the opportunity to  
37 take extra courses within the industry they will be entering;

38  
39 **WHEREAS,** During the presentation, Karen Myers-Bowman asserted that most students would fulfill  
40 the K-State 8 requirements by taking six to eight courses, equaling eighteen to twenty-  
41 four credit hours, opposed to the 18 credit hours required under the University General  
42 Education program. Although this is a mild effect on the number of course needed for a  
43 student to graduate, the K-State 8 General Education program will affect a student’s  
44 ability to take electives within their own major, as well as complete the general education  
45 requirements and graduating on time;

46  
47 **WHEREAS,** The Kansas State University Student Senate was presented the K-State 8 General  
48 Education Proposal only two and a half weeks prior to the Faculty Senate meeting in  
49 which voting action could incur. There was minimal student input throughout the  
50 formation of the proposal, with only two students serving on the General Education

51 Taskforce during the 2007-2008 academic year and almost no student engagement during  
52 the final revisions to the proposal.

53  
54 **WHEREAS,** The Kansas State University community would benefit from student engagement and  
55 input in the proposed K-State 8 General Education program, and student questions and  
56 concerns should be address prior to the passing of this proposal.

57  
58 **BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

59  
60 **SECTION 1.** The Kansas State University Student Governing Association does not support the  
61 proposed K-State 8 General Education Proposal as currently written.

62  
63 **SECTION 2.** The Kansas State University Student Governing Association wishes to be a part of a  
64 dialogue with Faculty Senate and the General Education Task Force to address student  
65 concerns and answer student questions regarding the K-State 8 General Education  
66 Program.

67  
68 **SECTION 3.** Upon passage by the Student Senate and signature of the Student Body President, this  
69 resolution shall be sent to Chair of the General Education Taskforce Karen Myers-  
70 Bowman, Chair of the Faculty Senate Academic Affairs Committee Doris Carroll,

7 **WHEREAS,** In the Fall of 2007, K-State students voted in favor of expanding the Chester E. Peters  
8 Recreational Complex;

9  
10 **WHEREAS,** Student input should be considered by the architects during the design phase for the  
11 expansion of the recreational complex;

12  
13 **WHEREAS,** Bill 08/09/02 created a special committee to assist in the design phase of the recreational  
14 complex expansion, and also review the architectural renderings;

15  
16 **WHEREAS,** Bill 08/09/02 was repealed on October 1, 2008;

17  
18 **WHEREAS,** A committee of students should be able to continue to provide feedback and assists in the  
19 design of the recreational complex expansion until the project is complete; and

20  
21 **WHEREAS,** Appointments to this committee will be subject to Student Senate approval.

22  
23 **BE IT ENACTED THAT:**

24  
25 **SECTION 1.** The Special Committee to Review Expansion Plans for the Rec Complex is hereby  
26 recreated with the following purposes:

- 27 a. Meet with the architects throughout the design and construction phase of the
- 28 Chester E. Peters Recreational Complex expansion.
- 29 b. Provide student feedback during the design phase of the recreational complex
- 30 expansion project.
- 31 c. Review the architectural renderings provided, while keeping the interests and
- 32 needs of students in mind.
- 33 d. Arrange for presentations to Student Senate by the architects throughout the
- 34 design and construction phase as needed.

35  
36 **SECTION 2.** The Special Committee to Review Expansion Plans for the Rec Complex shall be  
37 composed of:

- 38 a. The Speaker of the Student Senate and the Student Body President, who shall
- 39 serve as Co-Chairs of the Special Committee and shall be voting members.
- 40 b. At least five students, all of whom are voting members. Members shall be
- 41 jointly appointed by the Speaker of the Student Senate and the Student Body
- 42 President, subject to Student Senate approval.

43  
44 **SECTION 3.** The Special Committee to Review Expansion Plans for the Rec Complex shall submit its  
45 review to the Student Senate at the beginning and each of each Student Senate term,  
46 during which the project is in progress.

47  
48 **SECTION 4.** From and after May 1, 2011, Bill 09/10/01 is hereby repealed.

2 **EXTENSION OF THE**  
3 **SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO STUDY**  
4 **THE FACULTY EVALUATION PROCESS**

5 **BY:** Amy Schultz and Dalton Henry

6  
7 **WHEREAS,** It is important for Kansas State University students to have an equal opportunity to  
8 evaluate their professors each semester;

9  
10 **WHEREAS,** The current methods for student evaluation of faculty vary department to department, as  
11 well as vary teacher to teacher, with some students not even being given the option to  
12 evaluate their instructors;

13  
14 **WHEREAS,** A new Faculty Evaluation Process needs to be implemented to ensure every student has  
15 equal opportunity to evaluate their professor by the same method;

16  
17 **WHEREAS,** Bill 08/09/27 created a special committee to assist in defining policies and procedures  
18 that make up the new Faculty Evaluation Process;

19  
20 **WHEREAS,** Bill 08/09/27 will be repealed on August 1, 2009;

21  
22 **WHEREAS,** A committee of students should continue to work on bettering Kansas State University's  
23 Faculty Evaluation Process until all needed changes are made; and

24  
25 **WHEREAS,** Appointments to this committee should be subject to Student Senate approval.

26  
27 **BE IT ENACTED THAT:**

28  
29 **SECTION 1.** The Special Committee to Study the Faculty Evaluation Process is hereby extended with  
30 the following purposes:

- 31 1. Examine the current Faculty Evaluation Process.
- 32 2. Research and collect "Faculty Evaluation Process" information from other  
33 universities.
- 34 3. Form a set of "Faculty Evaluation Process" guidelines and policies to  
35 implement in future semesters.
- 36 4. Develop an information campaign regarding the implementation of the new  
37 "Faculty Evaluation Process" for students and faculty.
- 38 5. Form a proposal to present to Student Senate, Faculty Senate, and University  
39 Administration upon completion.

40  
41 **SECTION 2.** The Special Committee to Study the Faculty Evaluation Process shall be composed of:

- 42 1. The Speaker of the Student Senate and the Student Body President shall  
43 serve as co-chairs of the committee with full voting privileges.
- 44 2. At least three students, who shall be voting members. Members shall be  
45 jointly appointed by the Speaker of the Student Senate and the Student Body  
46 President, subject to Student Senate Approval
- 47 3. Two faculty members appointed by the Faculty Affairs Committee of Faculty  
48 Senate, who shall be voting members.

49  
50 **SECTION 3.** The Special Committee to Study the Faculty Evaluation Process shall submit its review to  
51 Student Senate at the beginning and end of each Student Senate term, during which the

52 committee is in progress. The committee shall also present its review to Faculty Senate  
53 and University Administration as needed.

54  
55 **SECTION 4.** From and after May 1, 2011, Bill 09/10/02 is hereby repealed.
