6 **WHEREAS,** Gary Hellebust, KSU Foundation President and CEO, has announced his intent to step
7 down from his position effective at the end of the calendar year;

8
9 **WHEREAS,** Hellebust has worked for the KSU Foundation for 23 years and served as President and
10 CEO of the foundation for 13 years;

11
12 **WHEREAS,** During Hellebust’s tenure as president and CEO, annual contributions to the KSU
13 Foundation increased by more than \$75 million to reach a record high \$99.5 million in
14 2008. Under his leadership a total of \$885 million was raised;

15
16 **WHEREAS,** Two major fundraising campaigns took place while Hellebust was President and CEO.
17 Both campaigns exceeded their fundraising goals, with the Scholarship Campaign raising
18 \$63.5 million, and the Changing Lives Campaign, which concluded in 2008, raising
19 \$529.5 million.

20
21 **WHEREAS,** Hellebust is a 1969 graduate of K-State with a Bachelor’s degree in Animal Sciences and
22 Industry, and he and his wife are members of the KSU Foundation’s Presidents Club, the
23 Land Grant Legacy Society and the K-State Alumni Association;

24
25 **WHEREAS,** Hellebust will continue to work for the KSU Foundation under a phased retirement
26 program beginning in January 2010. He will work off-site on mutually-agreed upon
27 initiatives for the foundation and the university; and

28
29 **WHEREAS,** In his time at the KSU Foundation, Hellebust has consistently been representative of the
30 idea of K-State as a “student-centered university” and has worked to ensure funding for
31 student scholarships and programs, and he deserves to be commended for his dedication
32 to students and the community of Kansas State University.

16 **SECTION 1.** Articles I of the Kansas State University Student Governing Association By-Laws are
17 amended to read as follows:

19 Section. 1. SGA Elections.

20 A. Elections Commissioner.

- 21 1. *The Elections Commissioner shall be appointed by the third Thursday of*
22 *October, by the Speaker of the Student Senate, the Student Body President and*
23 *the Attorney General, with the approval by Student Senate. Elections*
24 *Commissioner shall be responsible for carrying out the Kansas State University*
25 *Student Governing Association elections, carrying out all provisions of the*
26 *Elections Regulations Code, and reviewing and making recommendations to*
27 *Student Senate concerning revisions of the Elections Regulations Code.*
- 28 2. *Elections Commissioner shall be responsible for carrying out the Kansas State*
29 *University Student Governing Association elections, carrying out all provisions*
30 *of the Elections Regulations Code, and reviewing and making recommendations*
31 *to Senate Operations Standing Committee of Student Senate concerning*
32 *revisions of the Elections Regulations Code. ~~The Elections Commissioner shall~~*
33 *~~be appointed by the Speaker of the Student Senate, the Student Body President~~*
34 *~~and the Attorney General with the approval by Student Senate.~~*
- 35 3. *In the event of the resignation, removal from office or the permanent inability of*
36 *the Elections Commissioner to discharge his or her duties as the Elections*
37 *Commissioner, the Speaker of the Student Senate, the Student Body President,*
38 *and the Attorney General shall appoint a new Elections Commissioner within 48*
39 *hours of notice, with the approval of Student Senate.*

- 41 1. *The Student Tribunal shall be responsible for carrying out all provisions of the*
42 *Elections Regulations Code during the appeal process. No member on the*
43 *Student Tribunal shall be a candidate for any office by which the Elections*
44 *Commissioner has authority. ~~The Deputy Commissioner shall be appointed by~~*
45 *~~the Commissioner with the approval of Student Senate.~~*
- 46 2. ~~Duties of the Deputy Commissioner shall include tasks delegated by the~~
47 ~~Commissioner, excluding any election code violation rulings.~~

48 C. ~~The Elections Review Committee~~

- 49 1. ~~The Elections Review Committee shall be composed of five members not~~
50 ~~including the chair. There will be two members from the Judicial Branch who~~
51 ~~will be appointed by the Attorney General with the approval of Student Senate,~~
52 ~~and three members from the Legislative Branch appointed by the Senate~~
53 ~~Operations Committee with the approval of Student Senate.~~

CD. Election Procedures.

1. The Elections Regulations Code shall govern all Student Governing Association elections at Kansas State University.

~~DE. The Elections Commissioner and members~~ Members of Student Tribunal ~~and members of Judicial Council~~ shall not actively or passively campaign for another student's SGA campaign.

~~EF. The Elections Commissioner and members~~ Members of Student Tribunal, ~~and members of Judicial Council~~ shall not financially contribute to another student's SGA campaign.
