7 **WHEREAS,** Counseling Services Fee provides necessary services to the students of Kansas  
8 State University; and

9  
10 **WHEREAS,** Students have seen the many benefits of having Counseling Services.

11  
12 **BE IT ENACTED THAT:**

13  
14 **SECTION 1.** The KSU SGA Statutes 39-0107 is hereby amended to read:

15  
16 **UNIVERSITY COUNSELING SERVICES PRIVILEGE FEE AGREEMENT**

17  
18 This agreement made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of September 2008, between the Kansas State  
19 University Student Governing Association (SENATE), and Counseling Services (DEPARTMENT).

- 20  
21 1. The annual DEPARTMENT privilege fee budget (BUDGET) for Fiscal Year 2010  
22 shall be \$613,456.00. The DEPARTMENT BUDGET for Fiscal Year 20011 shall be  
23 \$631,860.00. The DEPARTMENT BUDGET for Fiscal Year 2012 shall be \$650,816.00.  
24 The BUDGET will be reviewed prior to Fiscal Year 2013.
- 25  
26 2. No privilege fee funds may be used for paying the Institutional Support Fee.
- 27  
28 3. This agreement supercedes any previous agreement made by Kansas State University  
29 Student Senate and/or Kansas State University Student Governing Association with the  
30 Counseling Services regarding funding of BUDGET and use of such funding.
- 31  
32 4. Any breach of this agreement by the DEPARTMENT will result in automatic review  
33 by Kansas State University Student Senate and such review could result in decrease or  
34 termination of funding of the BUDGET. The failure of SENATE to exercise any rights  
35 in any instance shall not constitute a waiver of such rights in that instance or any other  
36 instance.
- 37  
38 5. Within 60 days after the end of each fiscal year, the Director of the DEPARTMENT  
39 shall submit a written summary of the BUDGET expenditures to the Privilege Fee Chair  
40 for review by the entire Student Senate.
- 41  
42 6. No construction or renovation of a building or facility at KSU is permitted with  
43 privilege fees unless the fee was established by a binding referendum vote of the student  
44 body. (SGA Constitution Article V Section 510 Letter D and Article XI Section 1105)
- 45  
46 7. This agreement shall be governed by and subject to the laws of the State of Kansas.

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8. By signing this agreement, the representative of the respective parties hereby represent that each is duly authorized by his or her part to execute this document on behalf of such party that the party agrees to be bound by the provisions of the agreement.
  9. Bill 08/09/17 becomes effective upon execution of this agreement by: the Privilege Fee Chair; the Director of Counseling Services; the Student Senate Chair; the Associate Vice President for Student Life; the Vice President for Student Life; and the Student Body President.

5 **BY:** Senate Operations Committee

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7  
8 **WHEREAS,** The SGA Constitution currently provides that the boards of the SGA Judicial Branch  
9 "unless otherwise provided" are appointed by "the Attorney General, in consultation with  
10 the Student Body President"; and

11  
12 **WHEREAS,** The Constitution then provides numerous exceptions to the general rule;

13  
14 **WHEREAS,** The current language in Article VI of the SGA Constitution has caused appointment  
15 errors and misinterpretations; and

16  
17 **WHEREAS,** Other technical changes in the Judicial Article are appropriate to make at this time.

18  
19 **BE IT ENACTED THAT:**

20  
21 **SECTION 1.** Article VI of the KSU SGA Constitution is amended to read as follows:

22  
23 **601. JUDICIAL AUTHORITY.**

- 24  
25 A. The University President has authority over the operation of the campus judicial program.  
26 This authority is delegated to the Dean of ~~Student-Life Students~~ or his/her designee.
- 27 B. The Dean of ~~Student-Life Students~~ or designee shall assist the Judicial Advisor in  
28 advising and supporting the operation of the campus judicial program, and in some cases,  
29 may determine if there has been a violation of the Conduct Code and impose sanctions.
  - 30 1. The Dean of ~~Student-Life Students~~ or designee may serve as the sole member, or  
31 one of the members, of an administrative judicial board.
  - 32 2. The University President may authorize the Dean of ~~Student-Life Students~~ or  
33 designee to solely impose sanctions in certain circumstances.
- 34 C. The Dean of ~~Student-Life Students~~, by the authority of the University President, assigns  
35 the operation of the judicial program to the Student Governing Association (SGA) and its  
36 authority shall be vested in the SGA judicial branch, composed of the following boards:
  - 37 1. Judicial Council.
  - 38 2. Student Review Board.
  - 39 3. Housing and Dining Services Judicial Boards.
  - 40 4. Student Tribunal.
  - 41 5. Parking Citation Appeals Board.
  - 42 6. Ad hoc boards.
- 43 D. This judicial power shall include the disposition of:
  - 44 1. Non-academic university disciplinary complaints against students.
  - 45 2. Violations of the KSU SGA Constitution, Conduct Code, and Housing Policy.
  - 46 3. Interferences with students' rights and freedoms.
  - 47 4. Appeals of KSU Police Department or KSU Parking Services parking citations.
- 48 E. The SGA Attorney General shall be appointed by the Student Body President. The  
49 appointment shall be subject to the approval of Student Senate.
  - 50 1. Unless otherwise provided, the Attorney General, in consultation with the  
51 Student Body President, shall appoint members to judicial boards.

- 52 2. The Attorney General, in consultation with the Dean of ~~Student Life~~ *Students* or  
53 designee, shall determine which judicial board shall be authorized to hear each  
54 case.  
55 3. The Attorney General may appoint, with the approval of Student Senate, such  
56 deputies and assistants who shall be responsible to the Attorney General for the  
57 execution of their duties and subject to removal from office by the Attorney  
58 General. Such deputies and assistants appointed by the Attorney General shall  
59 have their duties and responsibilities specified in the resolution for approval  
60 submitted to Student Senate.  
61

62 **602. COMPOSITION OF JUDICIAL BOARDS.**  
63

64 Members of boards or committees listed in Section 601.C. shall serve one-year terms and  
65 membership shall be as described below.

- 66 A. The Attorney General's term shall begin the day following the last day of spring semester  
67 classes and conclude on the last day of spring semester classes the following year. If the  
68 Attorney General resigns, is permanently unable to discharge his/her duties or is removed  
69 from office, the Chancellor of Student Tribunal shall succeed to the office of Attorney  
70 General in order to exercise the authority and duties of the office.  
71 B. Judicial Council shall be composed of the Dean of ~~Student Life~~ *Students* or designee, the  
72 SGA Attorney General who shall serve as Chair, and five students as follows:  
73 1. One student, currently residing in ~~the KSU Residence Halls~~ *a University*  
74 *residence hall*, appointed by the President of KSU Association of Residence  
75 Halls.  
76 2. One student belonging to a fraternity or sorority, jointly appointed by the  
77 Presidents of Interfraternity Council, Panhellenic Council and National Pan-  
78 Hellenic Council.  
79 3. One off-campus student unaffiliated with any recognized University living  
80 organization *or housing unit*, appointed by the Student Body President.  
81 4. One Student Senator appointed jointly by the Chair of Student Senate and the  
82 Chair of Senate Operations Standing Committee.  
83 5. One student-at-large appointed by the Student Body President.  
84 C. Student Tribunal shall be composed of two faculty members appointed by Faculty Senate  
85 and five students appointed by the Student Body President in consultation with the  
86 Attorney General, one being designated as Chancellor, as follows:  
87 1. One off-campus student unaffiliated with any recognized University living  
88 organization or housing unit;  
89 2. One student belonging to a fraternity or sorority which is a member of the  
90 Interfraternity Council, Panhellenic Council or National Pan-Hellenic Council.  
91 3. One student currently residing in a University residence hall.  
92 4. Two students-at-large.  
93 D. Housing and Dining Services Judicial Boards.  
94 1. Housing and Dining Services Judicial Boards shall consist of:  
95 a. Chief Justices selected among students in good academic standing living  
96 in the residence halls or Jardine Apartments, by a process outlined in  
97 housing unit's Constitution.  
98 b. Associate Justices selected among students in good academic standing  
99 living within the residence halls or Jardine Apartments, by a process  
100 outlined in each housing unit's Constitution.  
101 2. Individual Housing and Dining Services Judicial Boards shall consist of:

- 102 a. One Chief Justice and a minimum of four, maximum of six Associate  
103 Justices. The majority of the board members present for a hearing must  
104 come from the residence hall, or Strong complex, in which the complaint  
105 originated. Exceptions must be approved by the Attorney General before  
106 the hearing begins.
- 107 b. A Residence Life Coordinator, Assistant Residence Life Coordinator, or  
108 designee, to serve as Advisor to the panel.
- 109 c. Other advisors as deemed necessary by the Advisor, in consultation with  
110 the Chief Justice.
- 111 E. Student Review Board shall be composed of one (1) faculty member selected by Faculty  
112 Senate and five (5) students appointed by the Student Body President, in consultation  
113 with the Attorney General, one being designated as Chair, as follows:
- 114 1. One off-campus student unaffiliated with any recognized University living  
115 organization or housing unit.
- 116 2. One student belonging to a fraternity or sorority which is a member of the  
117 Interfraternity Council, Panhellenic Council or National Pan-Hellenic Council.
- 118 3. One student currently residing in a University residence hall.
- 119 4. Two students-at-large.
- 120 E. The Parking Citation Appeals Board shall be composed of eleven ~~positions~~ *members*,  
121 being allotted ~~in the following manner~~ *as follows*: six students, three faculty members  
122 ~~positions~~, and two staff ~~positions~~ *members*.
- 123 1. Co-Chairs.
- 124 a. The boards shall have two separate and equal co-chairs – one being a  
125 student and the other being either a faculty or staff member. Each co-  
126 chair shall be a joint appointment made by the Attorney General, the  
127 Student Body President, and the Vice President ~~of~~ *for* Administration  
128 and Finance.
- 129 b. Each co-chair shall be selected from among the eleven board members  
130 being appointed to the board for the upcoming term.
- 131 c. Each co-chair shall simultaneously serve as a regular board member,  
132 sharing all of the responsibilities and duties of ~~normal~~ *other board*  
133 members, in addition to their specific co-chair duties.
- 134 2. Members.
- 135 a. The six student members ~~positions~~ shall be ~~filled~~ *appointed by the*  
136 *Attorney General in consultation with the Student Body President* ~~in the~~  
137 ~~following specific manner~~ *as follows*:
- 138 i. One ~~student living~~ *off-campus student* unaffiliated with any  
139 ~~organized recognized campus~~ *University living group*  
140 *organization or housing unit.*
- 141 ii. One student ~~from~~ *belonging to* a fraternity or sorority which is a  
142 member or the Interfraternity Council, Panhellenic Council *or*  
143 *National Pan-Hellenic Council.*
- 144 iii. One student *currently residing in a* ~~from the KSU Association of~~  
145 *University* residence hall.
- 146 iv. Three students at-large.
- 147 b. *The three faculty members shall be appointed by Faculty Senate, and the*  
148 *two staff members shall be appointed by Classified Senate.*
- 149 ~~b.~~ c. Terms for all members shall begin the Friday before spring finals week  
150 and conclude the Thursday before spring finals week of the following  
151 year, including summer break period.

152 e. d. A minimum of one student, one faculty member and one staff member  
153 must be available to serve as active members during the summer break  
154 period. If there is a shortage it shall be the duty of the Attorney General,  
155 in consultation with the Student Body President, to appoint summer  
156 break board members as necessary to fill vacant positions. These  
157 summer break appointments shall not be subject to approval by Student  
158 Senate. Beginning the first day of the fall semester, all summer break  
159 appointments shall be void and the composition of the Parking Citation  
160 Appeals Board shall revert to all original appointments previously  
161 approved by Student Senate.

162 G. Membership of all judicial boards shall be subject to the approval of Student Senate, with  
163 the exception of Housing and Dining Services Judicial Board whose members shall be  
164 subject to the approval of Judicial Council.

165 H. During periods when judicial board members are unavailable or as the need arises, the  
166 Dean of ~~Student Life~~ *Students* or designee, after consultation with the SGA Attorney  
167 General or designee, may appoint an ad hoc judicial board. Such ad hoc boards shall be  
168 composed of two students and one faculty-staff member, preferably with prior judicial  
169 experience.

170 I. No member of any boards described in this section may serve on more than one such  
171 board at any given time. A member may sit in judgment on a case which they have  
172 previously heard as a member of another board.

173 J. The Dean of ~~Student Life~~ *Students* or designee and the Judicial Advisor in consultation  
174 with the SGA Attorney General shall develop policies for the administration of the  
175 judicial program and procedural rules for the conduct of hearings. Such policies are  
176 subject to the approval of Student Senate and must be consistent with provisions of the  
177 Conduct Code.

178  
179 **603.** Final decisions of any judicial board may be appealed in accordance with Article VI, Section 13.  
180 of the SGA By-Laws.

181  
182 **604.** No member of the Judicial Branch whose appointment is subject to the approval of Student  
183 Senate shall concurrently hold offices within two or more branches of the KSU SGA, unless  
184 specifically permitted in the KSU SGA Constitution or By-Laws.

186 **SECTION 2.** This bill shall take effect when ratified by college councils.
