

**COUNCIL ON PARKING OPERATIONS PROPOSED MINUTES**  
**November 17, 2005 @ 3:00 pm**

4. The Chair, Jason Heaser opened the meeting.

5. Minutes were read individually. A motion to approve minutes as written was seconded and passed.

6. Bill Muir gave a report on the activities of the Finance Committee. At the first meeting, fees and fines were discussed in general. Reserved stalls were discussed in general and the possibility of creating different parking zones across campus was discussed. The over riding concept in all the Finance Committee discussions was fairness. The Salary differential was again addressed. The Finance Committee discussed the concept of adding a 3<sup>rd</sup> type of reserved stall, a 16 hour stall in addition to 12 and 24 hour stalls. The number of night classes and night enrollment increases was discussed in conjunction with night enforcement and requiring night permits. One discussion item concerned the ability of freshman to park on campus. It was decided that this was a long standing

privilege and would remain. Finally, a Student Senate Committee will discuss the possibility of using some remaining bond money as an off-set for various projects. One of these projects is as a parking garage off-set. It will take some time for the committee to come to a decision and present it to the SGA.

7. Dale Shipps presented the report on proposed changes from the Rules and Regulations Committee. The first proposed change concerned extending times when permits were required. Some concern was expressed about how McCain attendees would not receive citations. The box office is already fully occupied and can't do something extra. It was mentioned that consideration also must be given to athletic events. The Committee and the Council will re-visit concerns about McCain. It has been proposed that no new graduate students be allowed to purchase faculty/staff permits. Those that have faculty/staff permits now may continue to purchase them. Additional enforcement, longer hours, and additional signs showing permits are required have been proposed. It has also been suggested that students be required to purchase permits on KATS. Since students are so familiar with KATS, and grades and tickets are available only on KATS, this is not seen as a problem. Computers would be available for students to sign up at the Union and at Edwards Hall.
8. New Business: A discussion of the excessive violator rule ended with the Rules and Regulations Committee agreeing to look at it. It was noted that the Faculty Senate has approved Saturday classes. This will also be considered by the Rules and Regulations Committee when looking at enforcement and when permits are required. The Rules and Regulations Committee also agreed to look at the times when "color" of a permit is not important. Should Faculty/Staff be able to park in Student lots and Students in Faculty/Staff lots during winter Break? Then the question was asked concerning the variance between what the Reserved Stall Committee first proposed and what the Council finally approved. It was noted that 3 of the applications were very similar, but 2 were approved and 1 was not. The Council, upon reflection, decided to not approve all 3 applications viewed as similar.
9. Motion to Adjourn was seconded and unanimously approved at 4:04 pm.
