PHLIL Ethiopia Teams Test New Dryer Arc'teryx-designed dryer being validated in Ethiopia:

Teams at Mekelle University and Bahir Dar University in Ethiopia have spent the last couple of months procuring grain and testing the new tent dryer designed and donated by Canadian-based design company, Arc'teryx. The validation experiments, and comparisons with open sun drying, were initially conducted using freshly harvested maize grain at Bahir Dar University and sorghum at Mekelle University. An exhaustive dataset of grain moisture content, including temperature & relative humidity of air inside the dryer, was collected. Both teams found promising initial results that the dryer has a faster drying rate than open sun drying systems. Data are being analyzed and shared with the PHLIL M.E. as well as the Arc'teryx design team to initialize suggestions for improvements.
