RE: Concurrent Programs (a.k.a. 4+1 degrees) Changing to Accelerated Programs

Kansas State University is growing opportunities for undergraduate students to obtain a Master's degree with one additional year of study. We have referred these programs as Concurrent Degrees or 4+1 Degrees. To increase the legibility and visibility of these programs, we are changing these to Accelerated Programs.

This name change assists in distinguishing these accelerated degree opportunities from <u>KBOR's</u> concurrent enrollment definition, which is high school students enrolled in college courses for credit.
