On September 17, 2011, the Beta Kappa chapter hosted the first annual Jim Treece Memorial Dad's Day event in honor of Jim Treece. The day began with a golf tournament at Colbert Hills Golf Course, followed by a barbeque at the house.

House Improvements

There have been many improvements made to the house in the past year, the biggest project being a renovation of the main bathroom on the second floor. All the members of the house worked



alongside Housing Corps to make this happen. Along with the new bathroom new letters were mounted to the front of the house, lights were installed under the bench on the deck and along the sidewalk and stairs leading up to the house, and the flagpole was moved to a more visible location. The dining room floors were stripped and waxed and screens were purchased for the kitchen and dining room windows. The 2011 Spring pledge class recently painted the hallways in the house, put new siding and doors on the shed and power-washed and stained the deck. Additionally, the Parent's Club purchased new furniture for the living room from funds raised at the last two Mom's Weekend auctions. The new furniture includes four sofas, three end tables, two wing-back chairs, one sofa table, two lamps and two area rugs.

Spring 2011 Grades

For the Spring 2011 semester, Sigma Nu ranked 9th among fraternities with a GPA of 3.0768, above the All Fraternity GPA, All University GPA, and All Men's University GPA. Candidate GPA for the past two semesters, Fall 2010 and Spring 2011, ranked 2nd and 4th respectively among all candidate classes on campus. Five brothers achieved a 4.0 GPA.

Sigma Nu Spotlight


