Study Abroad Program

### PROGRAM

This program will provide K-State students with the opportunity to learn about the Canadian agriculture industry. Students will gain unique hands-on experience while participating on this tour. They will have the opportunity to meet with professionals in the beef industry and visit with them about their operations and issues they face.

### FACULTY LEADER

Dr. Dave Nichols, Professor in the Department of Animal Science at Kansas State University, where he teaches live animal and carcass evaluation, introductory animal science, advanced beef science, and livestock sales management. He has traveled to Costa Rica, Yugoslavia, and United Arab Emirates. He and his wife also own and operates A and D Ranch.

Dr. Karl Harborth, Assistant Professor and Extension livestock specialist at Kansas State University's Southeast Area Extension office in Chanute, KS. Dr. Harborth's research is directed toward cow and calf nutritional management, forage utilization, early weaning, supplement with distiller's by-products, and effects of Optaflexx on beef cull cows.

### CREDIT

Three hours of undergraduate or graduate credit for GENAG 505 will be granted by K-State University upon successful completion of the course.

### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The class will meet once a week for 50 minutes from March 23<sup>rd</sup> to May 4<sup>th</sup>. Information covered during the spring semester class will provide the students with tools for distinguishing the differences between the U.S. and Canada, Canadian demographics, culture and agricultural economy. Students will give group presentations, keep a daily diary of events during travel, participate in all tour and site visits, and submit a final written comparative beef industry report.

### COST

**Program Fees Collected:** \$1,932 (includes international airfare, transportation, lodging, study abroad fee, group meals, international health insurance)

**Tuition and Fees:** Tuition and fees for 3 credits. Division of Continuing Education Fee \$21.50

**Anticipated Additional Expenses:** passport fee, individual meals, optional excursions/tours, and miscellaneous personal expenses.

**Payments:** Payments for the program fees should be made to the Office of International Programs, Study Abroad Program, 304 Fairchild Hall.

K-State tuition and DCE fee will be billed to student iSIS accounts.
