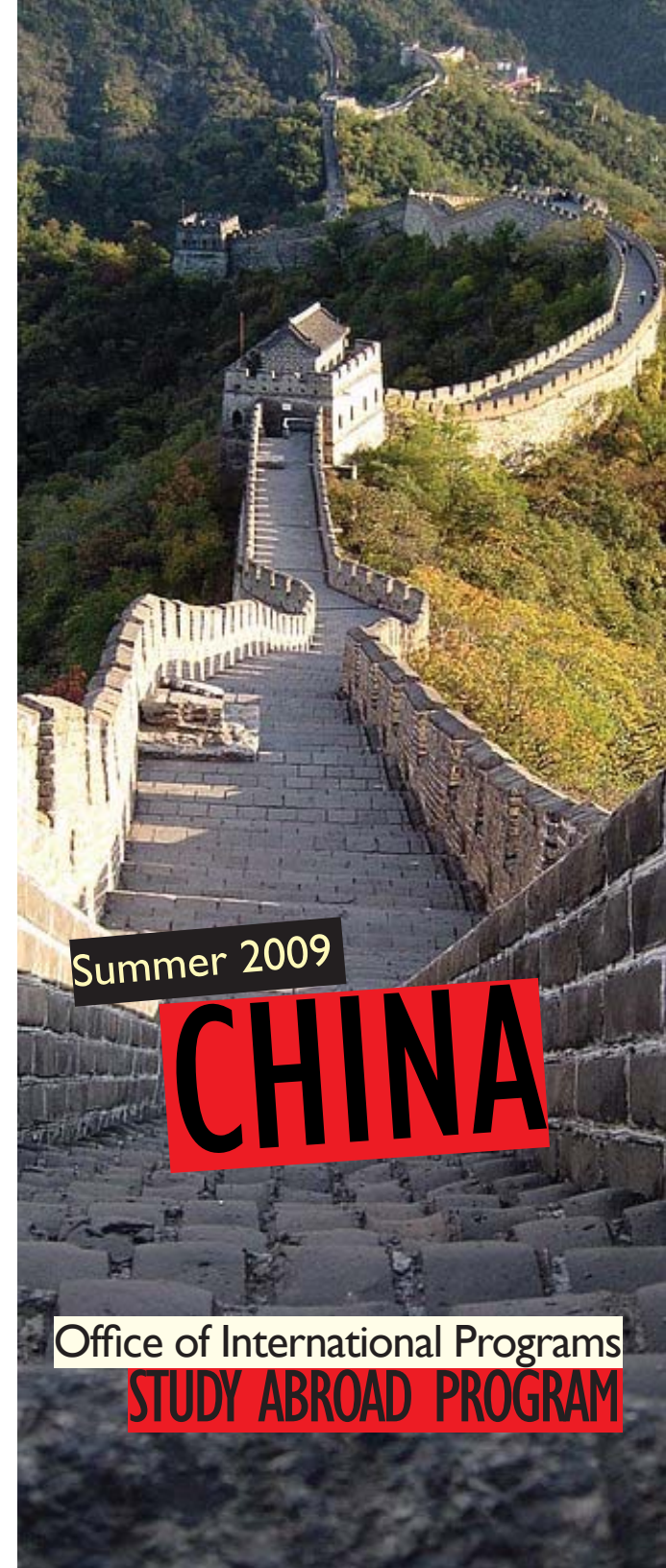

CHINA

PROGRAM

Seminars on Chinese culture, history, geography, economy, and politics will be given before the 17 day trip. Students will stay at Henan University of Technology in Zhengzhou, China for 7 days, attending classes and seminars on grain processing and utilization in China, and visiting grain related processing companies, elevators, and farms. Students will also meet Chinese professors and participate in various student exchange activities. The remaining time in China will be used for touring the capital city, Beijing, the historical cities, Lueyang and Kaifeng, and the largest and most modernized city, Shanghai.

PROGRAM DIRECTORS

Dr. X. Susan Sun, Professor, Grain Science and Industry, specializes in biobased materials derived from grains and biomass for adhesives, plastics and composites.

Dr. Hulya Doga, Assistant Professor, Grain Science and Industry, specializes in food process engineering, milling science, and technology.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Students are expected to learn and experience Chinese culture, history, geography, economy, and politics, and to learn and experience grain-related processing technologies, companies, elevators, and farms in Zhengzhou and Henan Province, China. Students will give either oral or poster presentations after returning from this course to share what they have learned with audiences from K-State. Students are required to attend all classes and to participate in scheduled activities.

CREDIT

Three hours of undergraduate credit for GRSC 790 (Grain Science 790) will be granted by K-State University upon successful completion of the course.

PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

- Tour grain-related processing technologies, companies, elevators and farms in Zhengzhou
- Visit the Great Wall and Forbidden City in Beijing
- Tour historical cities of Lueyang and Kaifeng
- Learn Chinese Calligraphy
- Tour Henan Historical Museum
- Explore Shanghai
- Learn Taiji Martial Arts
- Tour Shaolin Temple, White Horse Temple, and Longmen Grottoes in Luoyang City

COST

Program Fees Collected: \$2,864 (includes local transportation in China, group meals and lodging, study abroad fee, international airfare, international health insurance, admission into tourists sites, and Chinese visa)

Tuition and Fees: Tuition and Fees for 3 credits. Division of Continuing Education Fee \$21.50

Anticipated Additional Expenses: Individual meals, transportation to/from U.S. Point of Departure, books, and miscellaneous personal expenses
