# JAPAN

Study Abroad Program

## PROGRAM

This program will provide an opportunity for students to study Japanese contemporary architecture in a very direct and tangible form. Students will participate in daily field trips and weekly seminar sessions involving relevant topics. The main program will be field studies of selected buildings and urban sites, with the first part based in Kyoto and the second part of the program based in Tokyo. Students will be given first-hand experience with many important architectural urban phenomena throughout these two Japanese destinations.

## FACULTY LEADER

Professor Vladimir Krstic has spent a number of years in Japan studying and working. He has practiced architecture in Japan as a designer for Tadao Ando Architect and Associates in Osaka. Dr. Krstic was the recipient of the Japanese Ministry of Education Scholarship and holds a March degree from Kyoto University. In his scholarly work, Professor Krstic is mainly involved in writing and lecturing on the Japanese contemporary architecture.

## CREDIT

Three hours of either undergraduate or graduate credit for ARCH 655 International Field Study will be granted by K-State University upon successful completion of the course.

## ELIGIBILITY

Students will have a minimum GPA of 2.5.

## ACADEMIC PROGRAM

This program will emphasize an understanding of socio-cultural conditions which underlie the practice and ideology of Japanese contemporary architecture. The method of study will consist of daily field trips and weekly seminar sessions with assigned readings, presentations, and discussions of relevant topics. Students will be given a unique opportunity for an introductory study of Japanese heritage which is critical for understanding the developments on contemporary Japanese architecture. Students will do required readings, maintain a sketch book, and write a paper.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- Visiting Japanese cultural centers such as Kyoto, Osaka, and Tokyo
- Visit the Church of Light, Tama Amusement Center, and the Cubist Forest House
- Visit the Maki National Museum of Modern Art, Ando Underwater Temple and Yumebutai complex
- Explore Tokyo Olympic Stadium, Aida Memorial Park, and Maki Hillside Terrace
- Visit Awaji Island, Kobe city, Himeji, Daitokuji temple, Ando Garden of Fine Arts, Kurokawa Sony Building

## COST

**Program Fees Collected:** \$3,765 (includes international airfare, in-country transportation, lodging, study abroad fee, international health insurance)

**Tuition and Fees:** Tuition and fees for 3 credits. Division of Continuing Education Fee \$21.50

**Anticipated Additional Expenses:** passport fee, meals, events/tours/admissions, optional excursions/tours, international student ID card, transportation to/from U.S. point of departure, books, and miscellaneous personal expenses.
