PROGRAM

This is a very special edition of Geography 490, which focuses on historical maps of London, on interdisciplinary topics, as well as on major districts and neighborhoods in London. Between the two Queen Elizabeth's, from the 1550's to the present, London became the world's greatest imperial city. In this course we will trace London's historical geography using a variety of maps and readings. We will visit some of the great London museums; walk London's streets; and work through a series of field exercises.

To take advantage of the London venue, English 395 will use as primary texts the plays, movies, museums, and other cultural opportunities in London. Though the class will read plays and/or scripts ahead of time, primary emphasis will be on attending and then discussing and writing about the contemporary literary scene in London.

FACULTY LEADERS

Dr. De Bres' core areas of geographic research are in cultural geography and landscape, rural and regional geography, and geospatial analysis and application. Dr. De Bres has published over ten articles on topics concerning British geography.

Dr. Dean Hall has been in the English department for more than 25 years and is an expert in early American literature, postcolonial literature (especially of India and Pakistan), and former department head. He has traveled extensively in Great Britain and Europe.

CREDIT

Students will earn 6 undergraduate credits: 3 hours for Geography 490: London: A Life in Maps and 3 credits for English 395: London Theatre and Stage

ELIGIBILITY

Students will have a minimum GPA of 2.2 to enroll. Instructor permission is required.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The main purpose of the Geography 490 course is to help students understand London's evolving sense of place. Secondly students will come home well grounded in the street plans and neighborhoods of central London, how they have changed over time, and how they have been described by some of the best writers of the English language. Students will also read and interpret a variety of maps, including that of the famous London Underground.

The academic goals for the English 395 course are to understand the particular literary works, be able to transfer knowledge to read with pleasure other plays, become aware of the cultural, geographical, social, physical, and other contexts for the literature, learn to think critically about drama, and to express oneself clearly, coherently, and at length about the pieces studied.
